Abstract

As defined by United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) "a sustainable campus is one that develops process or management systems that help create a vibrant campus economy & high quality of life while respecting the need to sustain natural resources and protect the environment". In the case of Higher Education, UNEP has developed a framework that is intrinsically linked to the holistic approach of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals notably to ensure that sustainability is integrated across all levels of these institutions.

EC2U, as an Alliance of higher education institutions, strives at becoming a sustainable Alliance of sustainable campuses, integrating the seventeen United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs) in both local and global actions. EC2U itself was created around three core UNSDGs, namely UNSDG $n^{\circ}3$ – Good Health and Well-being, UNSDG $n^{\circ}4$ – Quality Education, UNSDG $n^{\circ}11$ Sustainable Cities and Communities. EC2U is also registered to UNEP to find inspirations in the many activities that this UN programme proposes. However, as the Alliance grows, it seems relevant to establish a continuous improvement process by defining additional activities linked to the other fourteen UNSDGs. EC2U builds on the impact of its Partner universities, individually and collectively, as well as on the potential of becoming a living model of sustainability, the "University of the Future".

The objective of this deliverable is, therefore, to lay out the different existing campus actions related to the 14 UNSDGs, led by the universities of EC2U, whether they be at the local or at the Alliance level. This document is the first step in sharing best practices, within the EC2U community and beyond, and will allow the Alliance to better integrate and align these practices across the EC2U members. The identified actions below are focused on concrete campus initiatives and will serve in the definition of additional future EC2U activities; activities that will be presented and developed during the future EC2U Fora. Furthermore, the information collected in this deliverable, and the activities that will be consequently defined, will pave the way for writing the EC2U proposal for the next funding phase.

I. Campus actions related to the 14 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals – at local and global levels

A. Context

Each United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (UNSDG) has a specific goal and a number of targets attached. To optimally share best practices in this document, all goals were reviewed from an institutional point of view in order to gather relevant information for each. This institutional viewpoint was inspired by the information collected from the initial proposal in which all Partner universities shared key activities and objectives of their organisation. For example:

- The **university of Coimbra** stated that one of their "fundamental institutional goals" is to "contribute to sustainable development, aligned with the recommendations of the UN agenda 2030, in line with the Green deal";
- The **University of Pavia** orients its activities to the pursuit of Sustainable Development and the SDGs of the 2030 Agenda and is committed to taking into account the social, ethical, economic, and ecological effects of its strategic and operational choices, also at international level;
- The **university of Poitiers** lists a number of initiatives such as the "Sustainable development and corporate social responsibility" and "eco-campus" labels as well as the "Gender Equality and Diversity Charters". It has also now included specific SDGs in its institutional strategy;
- The **university of Turku** clearly put forth that the university "has adopted climate change issues and sustainable development as a comprehensive strategic theme at all levels of the University community, and declared to be carbon neutral by the end of year 2025".

B. Objectives

As the goal of this deliverable is to focus on concrete, campus-based actions, the choice was to list initiatives developed by local teams, such as political and knowledge-creation actions, charters, frameworks, social actions, environmentally-friendly practices, awareness campaigns, etc. The actions have been identified at each Partner university, actions that are led either locally and/or individually as well as globally and/or collectively. Note here that a collaborative

















approach was adopted to ensure all members could contribute to this exercise. These actions have also been listed for each UNSDG, however as certain actions are transversal, the reader may find the same action under different UNSDGs. Collective/global actions are also differentiated with the 'world' icon in the tables below – and links have been provided for further information when relevant.



The Resilience Academy is a partnership between four academic institutions in Tanzania: Ardhi University (ARU), University of Dar es Salaam (UDSM), Sokoine University of Agriculture (SUA) and State University of Zanzibar (SUZA) with the University of Turku (UTU) from Finland. It is an initiative of the Tanzania Urban Resilience Program (TURP), a partnership between the Government of Tanzania, the World Bank, and the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO). Resilience Academy services bring inclusive education and research benefits for the partner universities, and improve employment of the youth with relevant digital skills. Via education and research actions, Resilience Academy improves societies' capacity to tackle urban challenges related to climate change and risks in the cities.

Potential – Promoting gender and culture sensitive career guidance. The project focuses particularly on producing easily accessible and practical educational materials for gender and culture sensitive career guidance. The aim is to raise awareness, and to transform the awareness about the gender and culture bias in career guidance into good practices to counteract it. The results of our development work will be disseminated in educational institutions and in guidance services nationally. Potential is created by Finland Futures Research Centre/University of Turku (coordinator), Häme University of Applied Sciences, Oulu University of Applied Sciences, JAMK University of Applied Sciences, Finnish Youth Research Society, Foundation for studies and education research (OTUS).
















UTU is a <u>customer of local supplier</u> that guarantees excellent quality of water.
In the middle region of the Archipelago Sea, an automated monitoring buoy has been in operation since 2006. The purpose of the monitoring is to collect detailed information on sea water quality, vertical stratification, and seasonal and interannual changes of the sea. At-sea monitoring is important for understanding the state of the sea, and is of fundamental importance to environmental management. Long-term observations also reveal trends and patterns that can help interpret experimental results or yield new research hypotheses.



All materials can be found digitally for registered institutions at www.opintokamu.fi (in Finnish and Swedish only). Kiva School® is an anti-bullying programme developed at the University of Turku. KiVa aims to prevent bullying. Creating an antibullying culture requires the commitment of the entire school community. Implementing KIVA can reduce bullying and increase school well-being and positive peer relationships — even learning motivation! KiVa has also been studied e.g. in the Netherlands, Chile, Italy, New Zealand and Estonia. In meta-analyses, it has been repeatedly identified as one of the most effective anti-bullying programs in the world. In Finland, over 900 schools are involved in the KIVA School programme and in addition to Finland, the programme is in place in more than 20 different countries.

Professor of Futures Studies Markku Wilenius is appointed to the position since 2016. The professorship is granted by the United Nations Education, Scientific and Cultural Organisation UNESCO. The aim of the professorship is to support futures work in the developing countries. The University of Turku begins the creation of a method for introducing futures work to developing countries in co-operation with UNESCO and the other agreement partners involved. Eight universities from, for example, Namibia, Peru, China, the United States and Germany, have already signed up as partners in co-operation.



	The Botanical Garden of the University collaborates with the Vegetable Germplasm Bank of UNIPV, which deals with the conservation of seeds of rare or threatened species. UNIPV holds the "Siro Negri Wood", a Nature Reserve for scientific research, educational and supervisory purposes only. Thanks to these restrictions the "Bosco Siro Negri" can be defined as an integral reserve, and has taken on a considerable naturalistic and scientific value.
University of Poitiers	Studies are led to evaluate the biodiversity on the campus, allowing the institution to know which zones need to be preserved and what actions need to be taken (planting trees adapted to climate change with a high biodiversity potential, installing insects' hotels, nesting boxes for bats or birds, creating hedges for connecting the woodland areas). Conferences are organised to create awareness among the whole community (students and staff), (e.g: <u>the link between biodiversity</u> and humanity)
University of Salamanca	Ecosystem Regeneration Project to regenerate the most degraded ecosystems in the city, as well as reconnecting people with nature. Regenerating the Earth and Human Consciousness project aims to generate positive impacts on the environment. University of Turku	 The Kevo research station lies in North Lapland, in Utsjoki, by lake Kevojärvi. We have studied subarctic nature and interactions between nature and humans for over 60 years. The Finnish Meteorological Institute has two weather stations (data available since 1962), a magnetometer station and an all-sky camera for auroral monitoring at Kevo. The institute of Seismology (University of Helsinki) has had a seismographic station at Kevo since 1964. Several other universities and research institutes also have their research sites, equipment or monitoring points at Kevo. Kevo provides a unique location for field courses, seminars and summer schools. Several courses and seminars are arranged yearly at the station by Finnish and foreign universities.

II. Concluding remarks

The section above clearly shows a diversity of actions led by the seven Partner universities of the Alliance, with concrete campus-based actions related to the 14 other United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. The list of local and global activities equally highlights the similarities between the Partner universities of the Alliance, the shared vision and missions that all members strive to implement on a day-to-day level. Note here that these concrete actions have an impact on the academic community, citizens, and local stakeholders.

This deliverable, in itself, serves three main purposes:

- Sharing of best practices across the EC2U Alliance: this document will be made accessible to all members of the Alliance. The list of individual activities, in particular, will act as a pool of ideas, a multiplier and a source of inspiration for Partner members, thus allowing them to duplicate certain campus-based actions locally.
- Defining additional activities for the EC2U Fora: as the campus-based actions led by the Partner universities (whether local or global) stem from shared missions, values, and vision, certain UNSDGs actions can serve as a basis for future common activities organised during the EC2U Fora, by integrating additional activities linked to the other 14 UNSDGs. These activities could be the opportunity to openly and effectively share the various initiatives of the seven Partner universities and disseminate concrete results.
- Provide a basis for the future proposal and the potential activities that can be led by the Alliance: the activities identified show the strengths of the Partner universities and will allow the Alliance to establish a first map of the different actions related to the UNSDGs in which the members are prominently active.

The above-mentioned is not officially included in the EC2U strategy and concrete actions are yet to be collegially defined with all Partner universities.
