D8.6 EC2U Forum: Programme and organisation + Archiving and dissemination of activities + Higher education round tables + Citizen Science

Abstract

The second EC2U Forum took place between the 19th and the 21st of May 2021 and was hosted by the University of Turku. Due to the sanitary crisis, the Alliance decided to organise a fully digital, online Forum. Many events were organised on this occasion among which two webinars on social sustainability and cooperation between cities and universities, a round table on microcredentials, a student's event, a workshop and even a virtual City tour. The event gathered more than 400 participants from 25 different countries, which enabled the wide dissemination of its content.

The deliverable related to this second Forum is a grouping of 4 deliverables from the EC2U proposal, namely:

- 1. Programme and organisation of the EC2U Forum
- 2. Archiving and dissemination of the EC2U Forum activities
- 3. Higher Education Round tables
- 4. Citizen Science

It is thus organized in 4 different parts, each corresponding to one of these 4 deliverables.





Speakers

Karina Weichold Professor, University of Jena

Karina Welchold studied Psychology at the University of Jena, Germany and the University College of Galway, Ireland. Besides that, she completed training in Family and Systemic Therapy, and finished her studies with an internship at the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva. In 2002, she received her Ph.D summa cum laude, and in 2012 completed her Habilitation. Six years later, Karina Welchold was appointed as Professor of Psychology at the University of Jena. Currently, she is the leader of the Department of Youth Research at the Institute of Psychology and the Dean of Study Affairs of the Faculty of Social and Behavioural Sciences at the University of Jena.

In her research, Professor Welchold is studying psychosocial adaptation under a life-span perspective, following a biopsychosocial and culturally-sensitive research paradigm with an explicit focus on the application of findings to intervention and social policy. Thereby, she primarily investigates the developmental periods of puberty and adolescence. Findings of her research were discussed in more than 120 presentations and symposia at conferences; she has published over 70 national and international papers and contributed numerous book chapters. Professor Welchold published a book, is currently working on two additional book projects, and she edited several special issues in high-ranking scientific journals.

Professor Welchold has a broad network with many national and international institutions in the scientific arena, but also in politics and practice. She is a member of several interdisciplinary expert groups, and serves as Main Editor of the ISSBD Bulletin for the International Society for the Study of Behavioural Development (ISSBD).

For many years, Professor Welchold has delivered lectures and taught courses in Developmental Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Life Span Psychology, General Psychology, Youth Research, and Methods of Psychology at the University of Jena. In addition, she is involved in the education of psychological therapists and she is a frequent guest lecturer at other European universities. Concomitant with her teaching reponsibilities, she has supervised more than 50 qualification theses. Professor Welchold is the coordinator of the course of studies leading to an B.A. In Psychology at the University of Jena.





















Gabriella Bottini Full professor, University of Pavia

Gabriella Bottini teaches Cognitive Neuroscience at the University of Pavia and is delegated with responsibility for areas concerning the University's Third Mission activities. She is a behavioral neurologist and her topics of research are the body representation in the healthy and damaged brain and the intersection between neuroscience Ethics, Law and Art.



Daniela Muntele

PhD, Associate Professor, Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iasi

Daniela Muntele is an associate professor at the Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences of Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iasi, with a doctoral thesis on the subjective state of well-being. She teaches disciplines related to health psychology and psychotherapy and coordinates student activities and projects; her research interests are related to well-being and health behaviors.



Sampo Ruoppila Research Director, University of Turku

Sampo Ruoppila is Research Director of Urban Studies at the University of Turku. He is also the director of Turku Urban Research Programme, a joint initiative between the City of Turku and universities to support academic urban research and promote research-based policy advice for urban governance. Dr Ruoppila is a specialist of urban policy and planning issues.



















Cristina Robalo Cordeiro Professor, Coimbra

Cristina Robalo Cordeiro is a full professor at the Faculty of Humanities of the University of Coimbra, of which she was Vice-Rector from 2003 to 2011. An essayist, translator and writer, she devoted her research primarily to French and French-speaking cultures and literatures, having also published monographs and scientific articles in comparative literature and in Portuguese literature. Honorary Consul of France in Colmbra, Vice-President of the European Association of Francophone Studies, served as Director of the Maghreb Bureau of the Francophonie University Agency, in Rabat, from 2012 to 2016. She obtained a 3rd cycle doctorate, In Poltiers , about André Malraux, In 1980, and a PhD from the University of Coimbra, on the work of Jules Supervielle, in 1991. She is the author of 17 books (essays, novels, novels and translations), and about 200 scientific articles. She is the coordinator of the National Reading Plan for Science, Technology and Higher Education, PNL2027 - Ler + Clência. She won the Richelieu Senghor de la Francophonie Prize in 2008, was awarded the Legion of Honor (Knight) in 2014 and the Order of the Infant (Commander) In 2015. Professor Cristina Robalo Cordeiro is part of the Working Group of the Candidature of Coimbra-European Capital of Culture 2027 and this would be her topic of presentation in the webinar (a joint application between the City Council and the University, among other Institutions).

She is experienced in managing EC funded projects, has conducted several higher education studies in Europe and participated to European level networks and working groups. Before Joining the Finnish Ministry of Education and Culture In 2018, she worked with the digitalisation, ICT development and digital service development in higher education sector as a development manager. At the Ministry of Education and Culture, she is working with national higher education policies, especially linked to digitalization and internationalization. She is also responsible for coordinating Finnish education policies at EU level, and participates actively to various EU level working groups. She was a member of the EU-level Consultation Group on micro-credentials and is one of the working groups leaders In the Erasmus+-funded Microbol-project. Jonna holds a MSc degree In Geography from the University of Turku with warm memorles.





















Frederik de Decker Head of International Relations Office, University of Ghent

Frederik is currently the Head of the International Relations Office at his alma mater Ghent University (Belgium). He also started his professional career in internationalisation there, more than 25 years ago, triggered by his own study abroad experiences in The Netherlands and Poland. Previously he had different responsibilities related to internationalisation and educational policy in various Belgian higher education Institutions. The last jobs he held before returning to Ghent University were head of the Office for educational development and Internationalisation at Artevelde University Of Applied Sciences (2000-2006) and senior education advisor (advising the board in various educational policy matters) at the umbrella organisation Ghent University Association (2006-2014). He participates regularly as an expert in international projects, mainly dealing with internationalisation, educational development, qualifications frameworks and quality assurance. Topics he frequently addresses as an (invited) speaker at conferences and publishes regularly about. He also chairs and participates in various advisory boards re. these themes at the Flemish level, e.g. the Working Groups on Internationalisation of the Flemish Education Council (Council for Higher Education) and the Flemish Interuniversity Council. His special interests are the concept of (International/Intercultural) learning outcomes/competences; microcredentials; inclusive mobility and sustainable internationalisation.



















D. Description of the event


1. Platform used for the event

The tool that was used for organizing this EC2U Forum is called Liveto Platform. It was chosen because it offers several useful tools for communicating and networking. In addition, it offers excellent functionalities for organizing a Forum online. Participants found it quite easy to use, and if they had any issues they were offered technical assistance. After signing up, participants had an access to all the virtual rooms and events of the EC2U Forum on the Liveto Platform.

Participants could create their own profile and choose if they wanted to be seen by others or not. They were able to chat and connect with other participants. There was an Instant Idea- room (where oneself comes up with an idea for discussion and invites people to join in.) and one-toone chatting possibility.

The partner rooms on Liveto Platform were useful, because all partner universities/cities had a virtual room, where participants could get to know each other better.

Virtual coffee rooms were located on the Liveto Platform and it gave everyone a possibility to connect and chat with each other after webinars. After the Forum all the recordings and presentations were on the Liveto Platform for two weeks.



















2. Opening Ceremony of the Forum

The Opening Ceremony was hosted by the Vice Rector Piia Björn of the University of Turku. The Minister of Science and Culture Annika Saarikko started with her speech followed by Choir of the University of Turku. At first, Rector Jukka Kola of the University of Turku welcomed everyone and then Manager of International Affairs Mika Akkanen from the City of Turku gave his welcoming speech. In between there was a 100-Anniversary video of the University of Turku. The Coordinator of the EC2U Alliance Professor Ludovic Thilly gave a short introduction to the EC2U Alliance before a video called Campus Life was showed. The last speaker was Aliisa Wahlsten, who is the Chair of the Student Union Executive Board.

















3. Webinar and Panel discussion on Social Sustainability

The host of this session was Ms Tiia Enges, Head of Student Support Services Department. Professor Karina Weichold started with a topic: Consequences of the COVID-19 Pandemic for Young People's Mental Health and was followed by Professor Gabriella Bottini with "Benessere: Third Mission and Public Engagement as conceptualized by the University of Pavia". The last speaker before the panel was Associate Professor Daniela Muntele talking on "Students' peerto-peer psychological support in times of health crisis". All the key-note speakers stayed for the panel, where the Specialist in Social Affairs Ville Ritola from On my Mind Project of the Student Union of the University of Turku joined them.

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














4. Thematic Discussions with Coffee

The idea behind virtual coffee rooms on the Liveto Platform was to offer a place for the audience to interact with each other, because that is what EC2U Forum is about: people meeting with each other and discuss freely. There were several virtual coffee rooms available each day and each coffee room had a space for 50 people.



5. Peer Support and Peer Counselling of Student in EC2U Workshop for Students

The online GLADE Counselling lab for students of all ages is created as special service of the Virtual Institute for Good health and Well-being (GLADE) from EC2U. It brings together all support services additionally developed by the International relations offices for students during their mobility - incoming and outgoing - and existing counselling services for students in the EC2U partner' universities, with the very new Peer Counselling online support.

The most active student association from each EC2U university have presented, during the workshop with and for Students, their best practices in supporting the international students performing a mobility, for a continuously improving approach of their Good Health and Well Being.

Moderated by the leader of work package four, prof. Daniela Soitu (University of Iași), Erasmus Student' networks, and other highly active student associations in EC2U revealed their best practices and shared their experiences. The speakers- Beatriz Gonçalves (ESN Coimbra); lolanda Bogleş (ESN UAIC Iași); Laura Mintstedt & Anna Lohmüller (ESN U Jena); Julia Hoppe and Lisa Kersten (work psychology/students health management U Jena); Matteo Carbone (ESN Pavia); Saturnin Agbofoun (Association "MAEVA"), Lina Fellah and Doriane Guion ("Etudiant.es Relais Santé"), both active at U Poitiers; Julio Heras Domínguez (ESN Salamanca), Kaija Kangasjärvi (University of Turku), Tiia Niskanen ESN Uni Turku and Satu Nurmi (Student Union of University of Turku) - framed a good peer-learning environment for all participants. Students, administrative and teaching staff have learned from each other how to support incoming and outgoing students' integration in the EC2U universities and their cities and about new opportunity all EC2U students will have by GLADE: to access the peer counselling for individual and group support.








7. Life in the European Campus: A Glimpse to Student Culture and Activities

The goal was to assess the perceptions of individuals from the alliance universities and cities towards personal, professional and societal level values, together with perceived obstacles and solutions for actively living these values.

The session at the EC2U Forum brought together representatives from the four stakeholder groups: academia (students & faculty), city and businesses to share their understanding and perspective on the results of the survey. The results will be made available as a "Recommendation for Policy-Makers" on the EC2U website.

EC2U Forum: Support and Co-operation at the Heart of the Discussion

How can we support each other during and after the Covid-19 pandemic? This question was highlighted at the second EC2U Forum hosted online by the University of Turku in Finland. Co-operation and learning from others was seen as a clear way to survive and progress.

The University of Turku and six other universities form the European Campus of City-Universities, EC2U Alliance. The objective of the co-operation is to create a pan-European campus with a new model of quality education. The aim is that the co-operation produces synergy benefits for education, research and innovation. The members of the alliance are Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iasi from Romania, University of Coimbra from Portugal, Friedrich Schiller University of Jena from Germany, University of Pavia from Italy, University of Poitiers from France, University of Salamanca from Spain and University of Turku from Finland.

The second EC2U Forum gathered together more than 400 participants and speakers to the virtual event. The participants came not only from all the EC2U Universities but also from the cities, stakeholders and other universities.




















- We are really pleased for the forum as a whole. Important, timely themes were presented and open discussions between students, administrators and the rest of the academic community took place, says Piia Björn, Vice Rector, leader of the WP2 and local EC2U actions at the University of Turku.

Coordinator of the EC2U, Professor Ludovic Thilly gave an advice to all at the Closing of the Forum: Let's keep the best and leave the rest.

- The EC2U Alliance is on a collective ambitious journey that started officially six months ago, but in reality, already two years ago. There are already hundreds of people working for the joint aim of the EC2U, and we are still at the beginning of the journey, said Thilly.

The three-day event focused on social sustainability, co-operation between universities and cities, micro-credentials, and student engagement.















Artist Blanche Elllis drew the forum programs into pictures.

- We heard examples of different ways to support students and staff during the pandemic when certainly everyone has experienced some sort of melancholy or loneliness. Peer support is needed also after the pandemic. There were interesting discussions on how life will change when we go back to normal – which won't be the old normal – and what we have learned from these exceptional times, said Rector Jukka Kola from the University of Turku at the Closing of the Forum.

Place to Share Good Practices

Rector Jukka Kola reminded that the EC2U Alliance builds up on the concept of the University in the city as promoted by the Pavia protocol and the Poitiers declaration.

- The most innovative outcome of the EC2U project will be the creation of the EC2U Forum. It allows wide interaction within and among the seven universities with their seven cities and local and regional stakeholders, said Kola.

He continued that the EC2U Forum plays a special role in exchanging and sharing good practices through the active dissemination of previous results and outcomes.





















- Excellent evidence of this were the examples we heard about the co-operation between cities and universities. This is something we all have in common and it brings us closer together as partners, said Kola.

Next Forum Organised in Salamanca

Ludovic Thilly pointed out that the initial plan was to meet in Turku, in person, shaking hands and drinking coffee in the same room.

- Covid-19 changed everything. We were forced to meet online.


















Rector Kola noted that since the Forum in Turku was completely virtual, the organisers searched for innovative ways to bring people together and give the audience opportunities to interact with each other. Atmospheric images of Turku were offered with videos and a virtual tour.

Everyone shared the wish that the third EC2U Forum could be organised at the actual place, in Salamanca. Professor Raúl Sánchez Prieto invited, on behalf of the Rector and the whole community of the University of Salamanca, everyone to the next Forum on the last week of October 2021.



Science Battle between Pavia, Poitiers and Turku

However, before the Forum in Salamanca, there will be at least one joint event.

Before we meet in Salamanca, we will have the first EC2U Science Battle on 24 September. The first Science Battle was held in Turku four years ago. It started with the idea of making research and scientists approachable to the public. It could also give someone an idea of becoming a researcher someday, says Björn.

Science battle is a playful competition in which a group of researchers from different fields sets out to solve questions submitted by the audience. At the closing ceremony of the Forum, a raffle was held to solve which universities will compete in the Science Battle next autumn. The lucky ones were the Universities of Pavia, Poitiers and Turku. The competition will be arranged during the European Researchers' Night on 24 September. Next year, the competitors will be the Universities of Coimbra, lasi, Jena and Salamanca. On the third year, the Science Battle will be organised between the winners of the years 2021 and 2022.

















- Second article:

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The EC2U Forum of Seven European Universities Challenged Participants to Consider Social Sustainability

Hosted by the University of Turku, the virtually organised EC2U Forum on 19–21 May included discussion on social sustainability, cooperation of universities and cities, micro-credentials, and thinking of ways how to recognise students' engagement.

Organised by the European Campus of City-Universities, EC2U Alliance, consisting of seven European universities, this year's EC2U Forum was hosted by the University of Turku and organised through remote connections.

The three-day forum includes webinars, panel discussions, and thematic discussions. On the last day of the forum, the participants have an opportunity to participate on a virtual city walk on the banks of river Aura in Turku, Finland.

EC2U promotes interesting and strong collaboration when it comes to European education and citycampus co-operation. The forums, organised every six months, aim to increase awareness of the EC2U Alliance in all of the participating campuses as well as share good practices and give rise to interesting discussions on important topics related to the universities and their partners.

Coronavirus Pandemic Threatens the Social Sustainability of Universities

The forum included a fair amount of discussion on the topical issue of the coronavirus pandemic and its impact on the health and well-being of the university communities. The keynote speeches and















panel discussion of Wednesday focused on the activities of the participating universities in aiming to decrease the negative impact of the pandemic.

Professor **Karina Weichold** from the Friedrich Schiller University of Jena, Germany discussed the consequences of the pandemic for young people's mental health.

- Students have had significant challenges with for example isolation and motivation during remote studying but also with their financial situation as they struggle to find work due to the pandemic. Up to fifty percent of the students have reported that the pandemic has a negative impact on their studies, Weichold explains.

The keynote speakers highlighted the importance of universities emphasising social sustainability in their operations. Professor **Gabriella Bottini** from the University of Pavia in Italy and Associate Professor **Daniela Muntele** from the Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iași in Romania presented programmes implemented in their universities to promote well-being of the members of the university communities. The programmes emphasised e.g. holistic support and psychological support given to isolated students.

From the University of Turku, Specialist in social affairs **Ville Ritola** from the Student Union presented the On My Mind project of the University. The project is based on peer support among students to promote well-being and mental health.

- The students need support from the universities, but we have realised that we can also train students to support each other. Empathy has an important role especially during the pandemic, says Ritola.

The discussions also stressed that the universities should learn something from the pandemic; the good practices and support given to the communities should be continued even after the pandemic is over.

EC2U is an Alliance of seven European universities whose aim is to create a pan-European campus with a new model of quality education. The Alliance led by the the University of Poitiers in France includes the Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iaşi in Romania, the University of Coimbra in Portugal, the Friedrich Schiller University of Jena in Germany, the University of Pavia in Italy, the University of Salamanca in Spain, and the University of Turku in Finland.



Topics he frequently addresses as an (Invited) speaker at conferences and publishes regularly about. He also chairs and participates in various advisory boards re. these themes at the Flemish level, e.g. the Working Groups on Internationalisation of the Flemish Education Council (Council for Higher Education) and the Flemish Interuniversity Council. His special interests are the concept of (International/Intercultural) learning outcomes/competences; microcredentials; inclusive mobility and sustainable internationalisation.

Sampo Ruoppila Research Director, University of Turku

Sampo Ruoppila is Research Director of Urban Studies at the University of Turku. He is also the director of Turku Urban Research Programme, a joint initiative between the City of Turku and universities to support academic urban research and promote research-based policy advice for urban governance. Dr Ruoppila is a specialist of urban policy and planning issues.





















Cristina Robalo Cordeiro Professor, Coimbra

Cristina Robalo Cordeiro is a full professor at the Faculty of Humanities of the University of Coimbra, of which she was Vice-Rector from 2003 to 2011. An essayist, translator and writer, she devoted her research primarily to French and French-speaking cultures and literatures, having also published monographs and scientific articles in comparative literature and in Portuguese literature. Honorary Consul of France in Colmbra, Vice-President of the European Association of Francophone Studies, served as Director of the Maghreb Bureau of the Francophonie University Agency, in Rabat, from 2012 to 2016. She obtained a 3rd cycle doctorate, In Poltlers , about André Malraux, In 1980, and a PhD from the University of Coimbra, on the work of Jules Supervielle, in 1991. She is the author of 17 books (essays, novels, novels and translations), and about 200 scientific articles. She is the coordinator of the National Reading Plan for Science, Technology and Higher Education, PNL2027 - Ler + Clência. She won the Richelieu Senghor de la Francophonie Prize in 2008, was awarded the Legion of Honor (Knight) in 2014 and the Order of the Infant (Commander) In 2015. Professor Cristina Robalo Cordeiro is part of the Working Group of the Candidature of Colmbra-European Capital of Culture 2027 and this would be her topic of presentation in the webinar (a joint application between the City Council and the University, among other Institutions).


