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D8.7 EC2U Forum: Programme and organisation + Archiving and dissemination of activities + Higher education round tables + Citizen Science

Abstract

The third EC2U Forum took place from the 27th to the 28th of October 2021 and was hosted by the University of Salamanca (Spain). This hybrid event was organized face-to-face, in Salamanca, and online with several open activities broadcasted on USAL-TV (University of Salamanca's YouTube channel).

The Forum was open to EC2U direct members, Associated Partners, students, and general public, and included a wide-range of activities, such as:

- an **inaugural conference** issued by Pilar Garcés García, Vice-Minister of Universities and Research - Junta de Castilla y León, presided by H.E. Rector Magnifico of the University of Salamanca, Ricardo Rivero Ortega;
- three **public conferences** related to the EC2U Virtual Institutes;
- open activities led by Ludovic Thilly, General Coordinator of the EC2U Alliance, such as a **debate** on 'How to enhance EC2U links between education and research' and a **higher education round table** on 'How to assess the impact of European universities?';
- **student events**: a sports events, an intercultural evening and an academic session on 'The future of higher education';
- an **official reception** by the Mayor of Salamanca, Carlos Garcia Carbayo;
- a **closing conference** by José Luis Escrivá Belmonte, Spanish Minister of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration, presided by H.E. Rector Magnifico of the University of Salamanca, D. Ricardo Rivero Ortega.

This EC2U Forum was the first EC2U Community face-to-face meeting and was the opportunity to include EC2U Associated Partners and local communities to transfer the results and benefits of the Alliance. This EC2U Forum strongly contributed to solidifying relationships between partner universities and laying the ground to continuing collaboration with EC2U stakeholders.

The Forum gathered over 200 participants of which 130 were in situ. Participants joined online, from 15 different countries, enabling the wide dissemination of the event's content and outcomes with major stakeholders.

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I. Programme and organisation of the EC2U Forum

A. Launching and organising the EC2U Forum

1. Defining the Forum programme with the EC2U ExeCo

Ludovic Thilly, EC2U Coordinator, and Efreem Yildiz Saldak, Vice-Rector for International Relations at the University of Salamanca, announced the dates and location for the third EC2U Forum during the Executive Committee n° 7 (17/05/2021).

The University of Salamanca defined the programme in collaboration with:

- local professors, staff and other stakeholders to develop an appropriate agenda and consequently organize the event;
- EC2U Coordination team, WP Boards and the University of Turku to detail needs and expectations
- Executive Committee for the validation of the agenda

The first draft of the programme was presented and validated during the ninth Executive Committee (13/07/2021) by Raúl Sánchez Prieto, WP5 Leader.

In July 2021, the first technical meetings with the [Fundación General de la Universidad de Salamanca](#), were established to start preparing certain organizational aspects of the Forum. The *Fundación General de la Universidad de Salamanca* was subcontracted for all management and technical services, as well as the practical organization of the Forum in Salamanca.

B. Communication and dissemination of the Forum: pre-event communication

Communication before the event was crucial to enhance EC2U visibility and ensure participation from a wide range of stakeholders, notably local citizens and Associated Partners. EC2U chose to promote the event using both physical and virtual communication material, notably by leveraging EC2U tools for external communication and dissemination (refer to T8.2 in the proposal). Additionally, EC2U collaborated with the *Fundación General de la Universidad de Salamanca* to complete EC2U promotional material when needed.

1. Creation of an official webpage to promote the Forum Programme

Within the organisation of the event, a point of interest was developing an online space to communicate the Forum programme with students, staff, local communities, Associated Partners etc. Therefore, the *Fundación General* designed a specific [webpage for the EC2U Forum](#) which detailed the programme of the event.

This webpage was designed to externally disseminate key information about the Forum. The format and content were adapted to the Forum's target audience: the webpage was in English, continually accessible over a given period of time and complementary to other EC2U

communication channels. The webpage also introduced the Forum with a welcome word from the Rector of Salamanca, Ricardo Rivero Ortega.

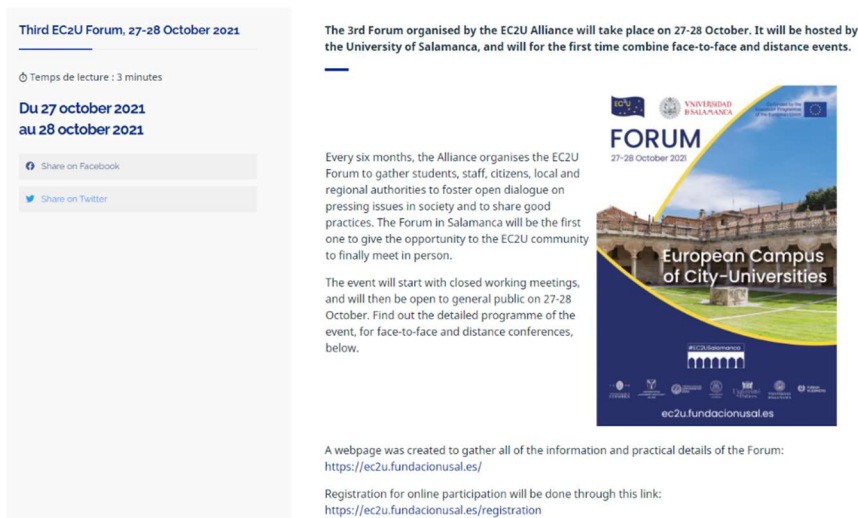


Figure 2 : screenshot of the first article published for the third EC2U Forum on the EC2U website

El Campus Europeo de Ciudades Universitarias (EC2U) es una alianza multicultural y multilingüe formada por siete universidades de larga trayectoria y representa a una comunidad de 160.000 estudiantes y 20.000 miembros del personal, con un alcance directo de más de 1 600 000 ciudadanos.

El objetivo de este Forum es celebrar un encuentro entre las universidades participantes de la Alianza EC2U donde se realizarán diversas reuniones de los grupos de trabajo del proyecto, de sus órganos de gobierno, así como distintas actividades académicas: conferencias, mesas redondas y debates. El Fórum también contará con la presencia de un nutrido grupo de cuarenta estudiantes procedentes de las universidades miembros de la alianza EC2U con un programa propio de actividades y otros actos culturales. En el encuentro también estarán presentes representantes de entidades asociadas al proyecto EC2U de fuera del ámbito universitario, como Ayuntamientos, Cámaras de Comercio y Parques Científicos o Tecnológicos entre otros. El formato del Forum celebrará todas sus sesiones en modo híbrido: contará con la asistencia presencial de un centenar de asistentes y asistencia online estimada de mil participantes.

Dicho encuentro tendrá lugar en la Hospedería Fonseca y el Edificio Histórico de la Universidad de Salamanca durante los días **27 y 28 de octubre de 2021** en horario de mañana y de tarde y en el participarán representantes de las universidades de Salamanca (España), de Coimbra (Portugal), Iasi (Rumania), Jena (Alemania), Pavia (Italia), Poitiers (Francia) y Turku (Finlandia).

El acto inaugural contará con la presencia de D^a. Pilar Garcés García Viceconsejera de Universidades e Investigación - Junta de Castilla y León y en la clausura estará presente D. José Luis Escrivá Belmonte, Ministro de Inclusión, Seguridad Social y Migraciones.

Social media publications were organized according to an editorial calendar, suggested by the EC2U Coordination Team. The objective of digital communication was to increase online registrations and the global visibility of EC2U and its events. Two hashtags were dedicated to the event: #EC2USalamanca and #EC2UForum2021.

Before the event, about 22 publications were posted on Twitter, Instagram, Facebook and LinkedIn, leading the audience to the articles published on the different websites and/or directly to the registration page.

Christine Fernandez-Maloigne was graduated at the University of Technology of Compiègne, France, as a computer engineer in 1986. She received her Ph.D. degree in Image Processing in 1989. She was associated Professor in UTC between 1990 and 1996 and she succeeded in her accreditation to supervise research in Mathematics at the University of Lille 1. Then she moved to the University of Poitiers, in 1996, to create a new research pole for colour image processing and analysis. Afterwards she was co-founder member of the French National Colour Imaging Group in 2000 and General Chair of the 1st European Conference about Colour in Graphics Image and Processing in 2002. In 2008 she took the direction of Signal Image and Communications laboratory, joint unit research of CNRS and University of Poitiers, part of XLim Institute, selected as one the 15 French Laboratories of Excellence (LABEX) in the area of information and communication sciences and technologies, in 2011. She was deputy director of XLim in charge of the topic Security of the Labex between 2013 and 2016. She is currently director of a CNRS research federation, MIREs, in the area of mathematics, image processing, computer graphics, computer science and communication systems. She is also Vice-Rector of Poitiers University, in charge of International Relations. At a national level, she is currently elected member of the National Council of the French Universities where she was also elected between 2008 and 2012 and appointed member between 2016 and 2019. Between sept 2012 and dec 2015, she was member of the executive board of the CNRS institute INS2I. She is also an expert for the National Agency of Research, the National Agency of Research and Teaching Evaluation (HCERES), the General Direction of Armies, and the European Commission. At an international level, she is also French representative and secretary of the CIE Division 8 (Commission Internationale de l'Eclairage, Image Technology Division) and deputy editor-in-chief of the well-known JOSA A journal.

Professor Nappi's major interests are psych neuroendocrinology of female reproductive and post-reproductive life, with a special focus on women's sexual health.

She has published more than 300 scientific articles in peer-reviewed journals and international books, with around 17,000 citations (HF Google Scholar 70).

She is a well-known speaker on women's health from adolescence to menopause and has participated in many international meetings and research projects in the field of contraception, menopause and female sexual dysfunction.

He entered politics in 2001 as a member of the Partido Popular (PP). He began as head of the Studies and Documentation Service of the Regional Ministries of the Presidency and Territorial Administration and of the Interior and Justice of the Junta de Castilla y León. He was then a member of the Castile and Leon Prices Commission and deputy councillor of the Economic and Social Council. He then made the leap to Salamanca's municipal politics as councillor for Development and Heritage. In 2015 he was appointed first deputy mayor. On 20 December 2018, he was sworn in as the new mayor of Salamanca, replacing Alfonso Fernández Mañueco, who left the mayor's office to run for the regional presidency.



Dana Strauss **Head of office of the regional network, University of Jena**

Dana Strauss works as the head of office of the regional network JenaVersum at the University of Jena. She is responsible for coordinating the collaborative platform in order to strengthen the dialogue between research institutions, the city, and businesses. Prof. Dr. Ricardo Rivero Ortega **Rector, University of Salamanca**

He studied Law at the University of Salamanca, completing the fifth year of his degree as an Erasmus scholar at the University of Amsterdam (The Netherlands). He later obtained his doctorate after research stays at the University of Freiburg (Germany). He has also spent time as a guest lecturer or researcher at the University of Paris X-Nanterre (France) and at the Research Institute for Public Administration in Speyer (Germany).

He has been a guest lecturer and researcher at the universities of Buenos Aires (UBA), Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM), Sao Paulo (USP), Universidad del Rosario in Colombia (Universidad del Rosario), Universidad Nacional de La Plata in Argentina (UNLP), Universidad Nacional del Rosario in Argentina (UNR), Universidad del Litoral in Argentina (Universidad del Litoral) and Universidad Nacional de Costa Rica (UNA).

He is honorary professor at the University of La Plata (Argentina) and the (UNPHU) in Santo Domingo. He holds honorary doctorates from the universities of Cordoba (Argentina),

Mackenzie (Brazil), Panama, Tecnológica de Santiago de los Caballeros (Dominican Republic), Mayor de San Marcos (Peru) and San Agustín de Arequipa (Peru).

He is the author of 24 books and more than one hundred research papers,³ which can be consulted in the Dialnet database. His specialities are economic administrative law, regulation, local government and innovation applied to administrative institutions.

In the field of university management, he has served as University Ombudsman (2005-2009), a position to which he was elected by an absolute majority of the Senate of the University of Salamanca and served as Dean of the Faculty of Law of the USAL from May 2012 to May 2017.

His mandate as Rector of the University of Salamanca is characterised by the defence of the University as a public service. He maintains that universities, in addition to being transmitters and producers of knowledge, must be involved in improving their immediate social environment.⁴ He defends the need for humanism in university classrooms⁵ and the role of the University of Salamanca as an academic bridge between Europe and Latin America,^{6,7} in the commemoration of the 800 years of history of this university, the oldest Spanish-speaking university, which has been teaching since 1218.

In 2019, 2020 and 2021, he appears among the 25 most influential people in Spain in the area of Education (ranked 14th),⁸ 910 also among the 25 most influential people in Castilla y León (ranked 23rd)¹¹ and among the 500 most influential people in the whole country (ranked 28312), all according to the study "The 500 most influential Spaniards" by the Marqués de Oliva Foundation¹³.

D. The description of the third EC2U Forum

1. EC2U Forum access and practical information

The third EC2U Forum was the first Forum to combine face-to-face and online events. The event was also available to the general public via open, live streaming sessions.

The physical meetings highly contributed to the experience shared by EC2U staff, students, Associated Partners and citizens and ensured a clear way of openly sharing the project to the various stakeholders.

a) EC2U Forum venue

Two main venues were used during the event for the parties present in Salamanca. The locations were chosen and adapted according to the different activities included in the EC2U programme:

- Hospedería Fonseca
Lunch was held in the Colegio Fonseca, adjacent building from the Hospedería Fonseca.
- Old University Building

Both locations were in the city centre, located in the old part of Salamanca; ideal for participants to discover the University of Salamanca as well as the historical parts of the town.

b) Online accessibility

Live streaming of Forum activities

The Opening and Closing of the Forum as well as all Public Conferences on the Virtual Institutes were broadcasted (live streaming) on USAL-TV, the University of Salamanca's official YouTube channel to expand the audience base.

Events organised in hybrid mode

A total of 8 activities were organized in hybrid mode, hence allowing the audience to attend in-person or virtually via Zoom meetings.

Hybrid meetings were key to the third Forum to ensure a consistent experience for all attendees. This method also allowed EC2U to expand the audience base while improving accessibility and inclusivity.

c) Registration

All participants could register on the 27th of October in the main hall of the conference venue, Hospedería Fonseca. Note here that registration was also possible before the event.

A booth, held by EC2U and USAL hostesses, was open from 8:30am to 12:30pm to welcome attendants and ensure they had all the needed Forum information as well as pamphlets on the city of Salamanca. For example, a notepad including the full programme was provided to all participants.

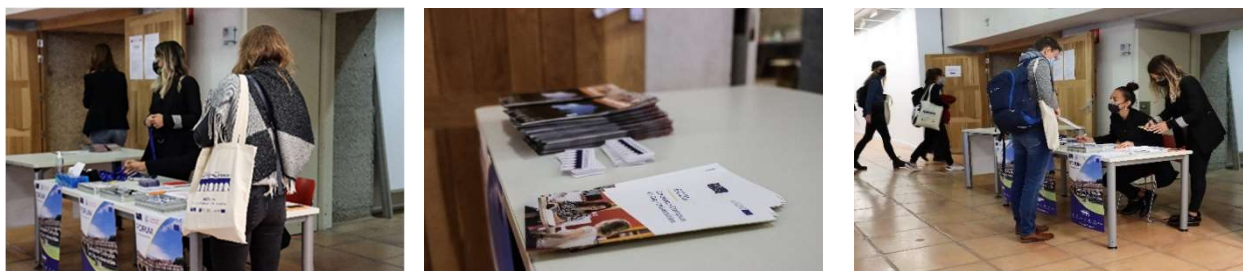


Figure 5 : EC2U Forum Registration in Salamanca

3. Inaugural conference

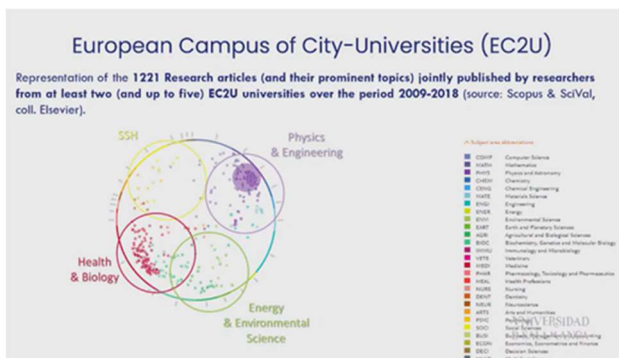

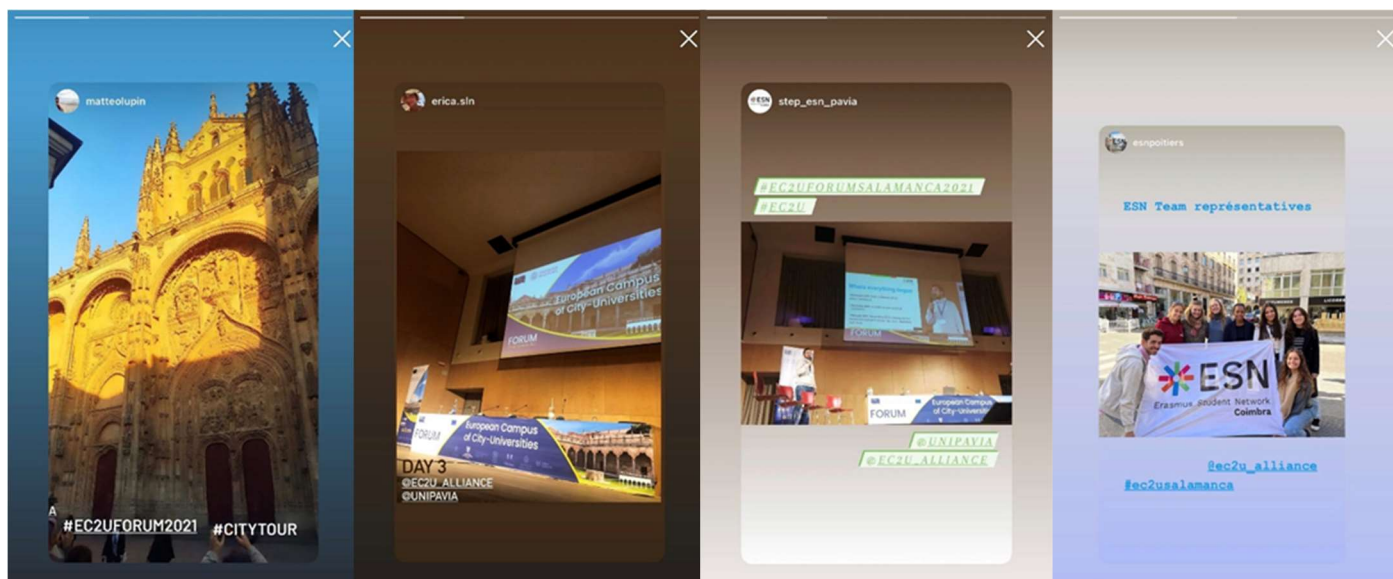


Figure 15: screenshots of live stories published on social media accounts during the EC2U Forum

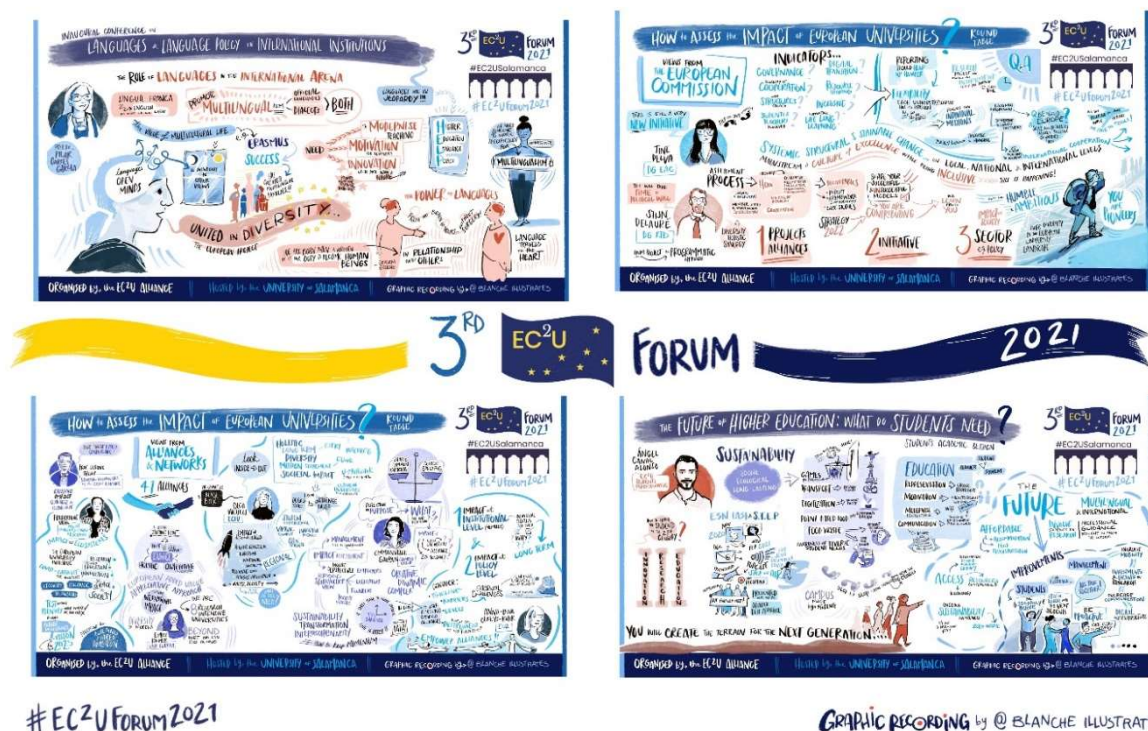


Figure 16: graphic recordings of the third EC2U Forum – by Blanche Ellis

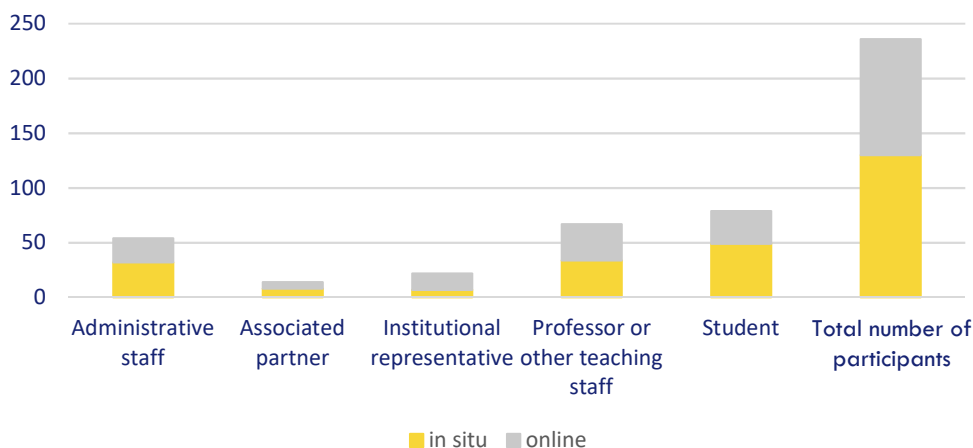

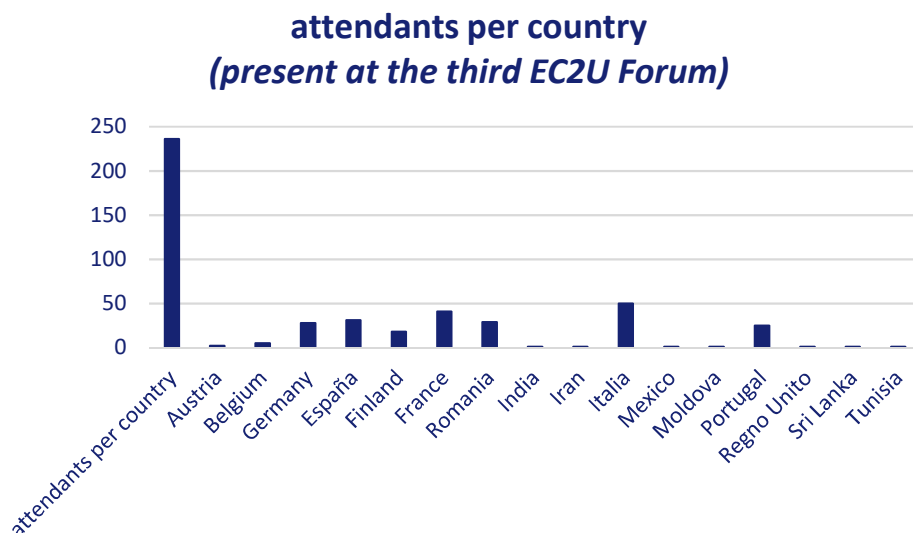


Figure 17: attendants per country (present at the third EC2U Forum)

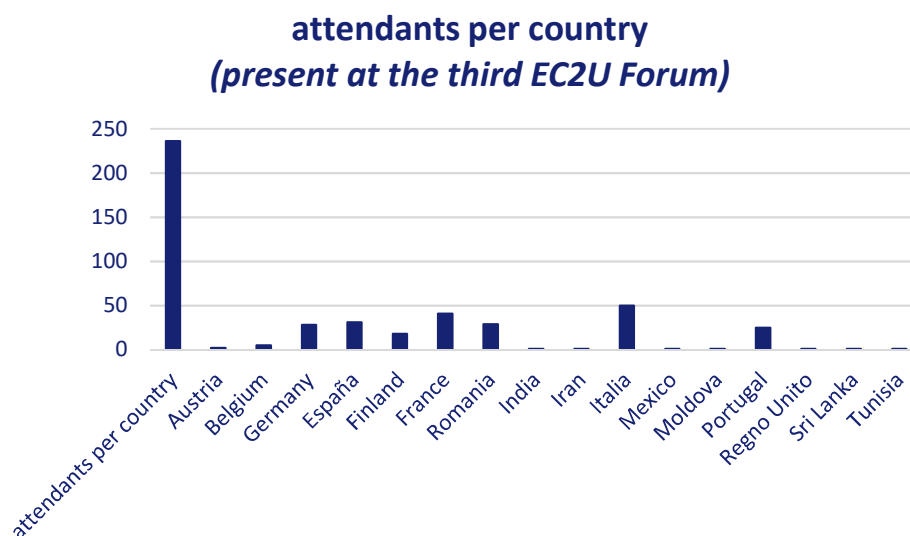


Figure 18 : attendants per country (present at the third EC2U Forum)

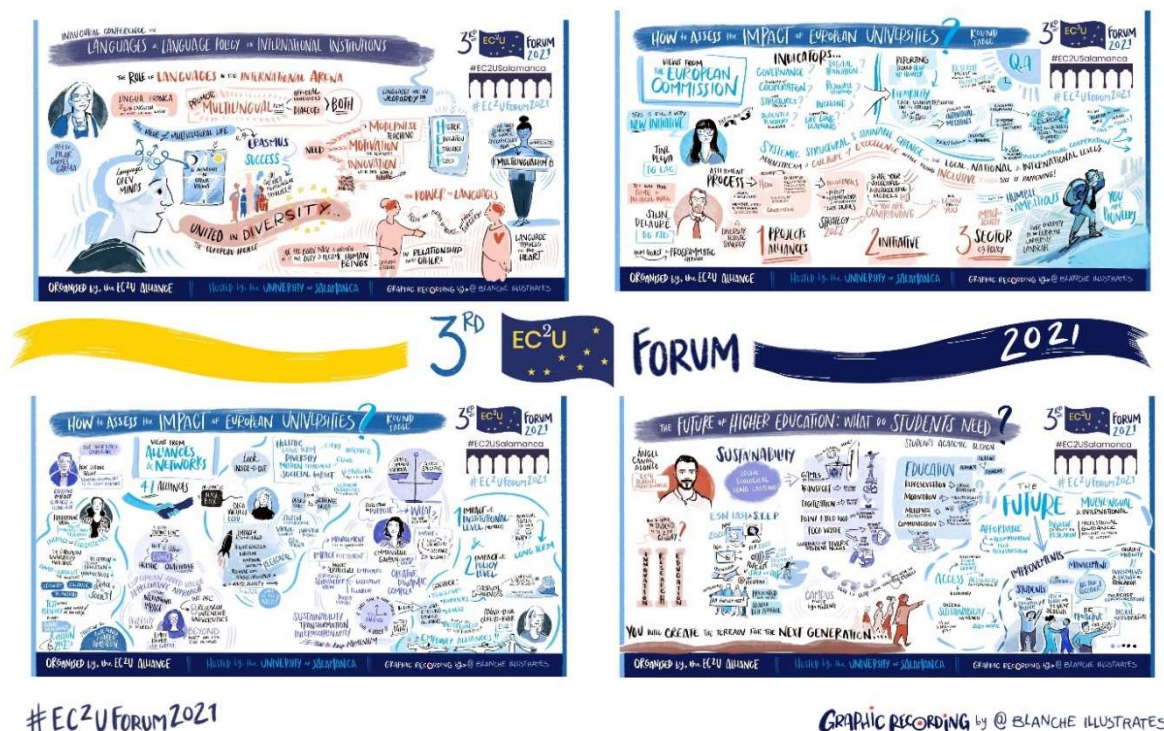


Figure 19 : a collection of illustrations of the third EC2U Forum - by Blanche Ellis

2. Description of the session

This round table, introduced and led by Ludovic Thilly, started by an introductory video of Frédérique Vidal, French Minister of Higher Education, Research and Innovation in which she highlighted the impact of European Alliances on shared ecosystems and their importance in training future generations. Emphasizing on Alliances' role in Europe attractiveness, Minister Vidal noted also the innovative approach of European Alliances to strengthen their ties and cooperation.

Following the introductory video, representatives from other Alliances and networks built upon what Minister Vidal said. For example, Emily Palmer mentioned the added value of Alliances and the diversity of models; Olga Wessels talked about European Alliances' impact at different levels from higher education to the wider society; Emmanuelle Gardan discussed the sustainability of Alliances, and finally Anna-Lena Claeys-Kulik gave an overview of the different challenges and how best Europe can empower Alliances.

Speakers from the European Commission, Tine Delva and Stijn Delauré, also gave a presentation on assessing the *Progress and transformational impact potential of the European Universities initiative*. These speakers concluded the session highlighting the importance of: monitoring progress of the European Universities Initiative; taking into account experiences and lessons learnt from the Alliance; monitoring progress of the wider higher education sector.

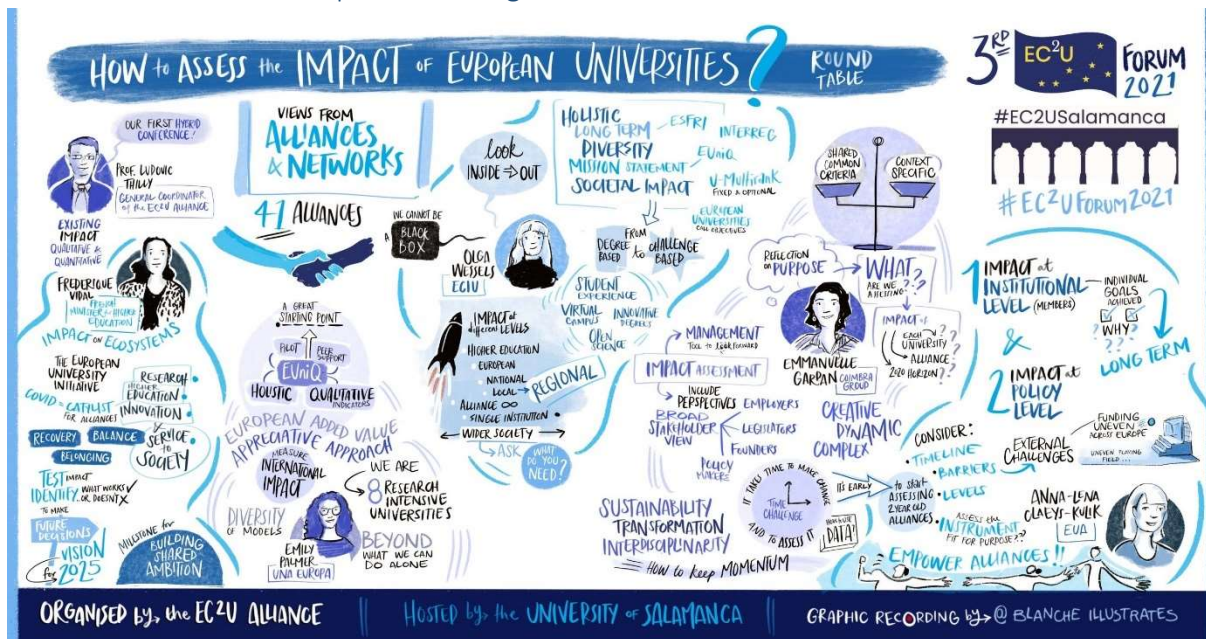


Figure 20: graphic recording of the session How to assess the impact of European Universities – by Blanche Ellis

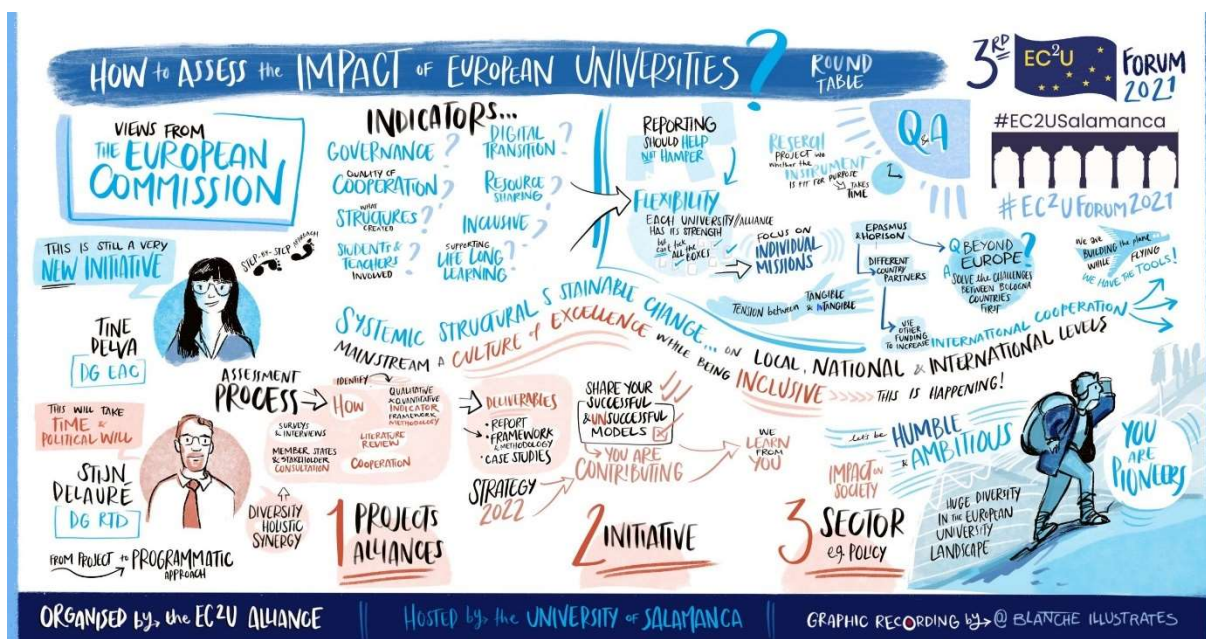


Figure 21: graphic recording of the session How to assess the impact of European Universities – by Blanche Ellis

Invited students from all partner universities presented various answers to student life and campus challenges. This session was a chance for EC2U staff, Associated Partners and local citizens to better gather student feedback to integrate student voices and experiences into EC2U activities.

The students had the opportunity to prepare the session the previous day and key topics came to light, which were interestingly linked to the core EC2U United Nations Sustainable Development Goals: Quality Education (UNSDG n°4) and Sustainable Cities and Communities (UNSDG n°11). Students also shared solutions they thought appropriate according to the different topics, notably:

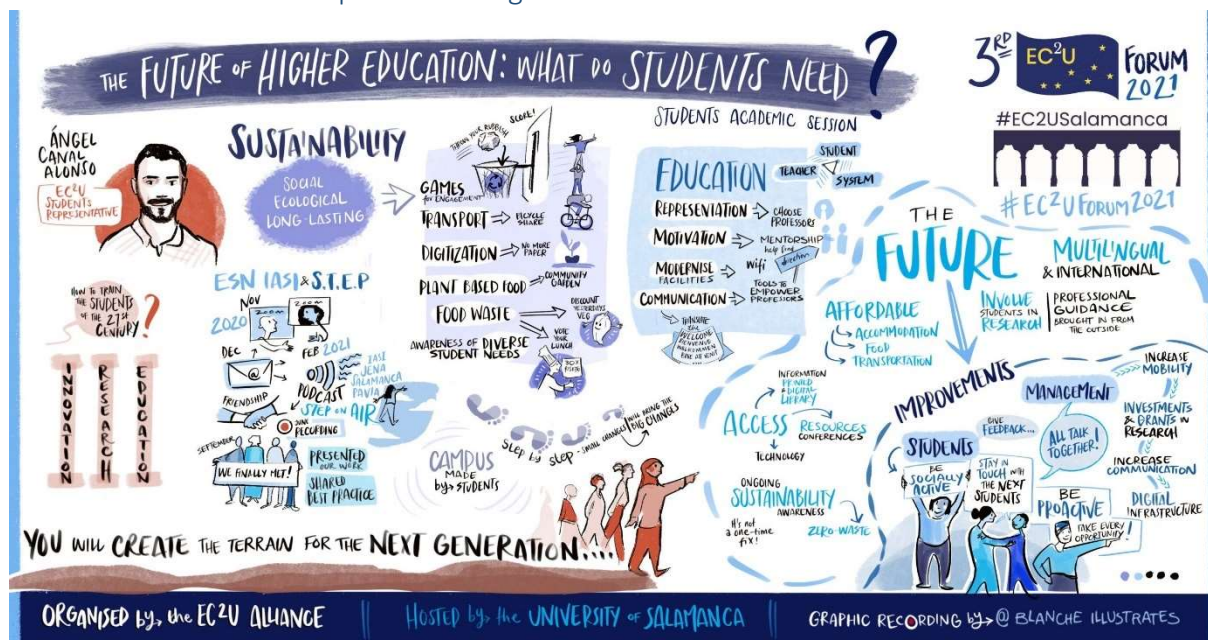


Figure 22 : graphic recording of the academic session – by Blanch Ellis

2. Description of the session

Ludovic Thilly, General Coordinator of the EC2U Alliance, started this conference with a general overview of the EC2U Alliance, providing key facts and figures on the partner universities within the Alliance. A point of interest was the potential in shared research areas between members. As speaker, he also put forth the three UNSDGs that the EC2U Alliance is focused on and highlighted EC2U related activities; notably the three Virtual Institutes launched in 2021.

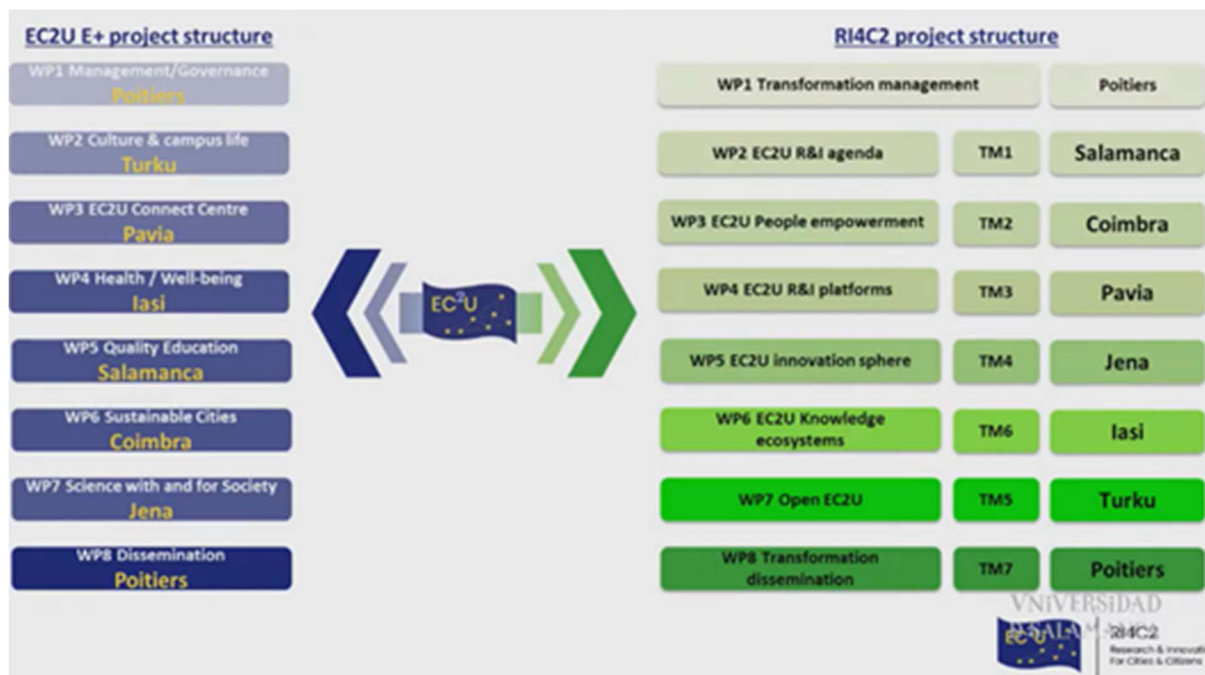
Note here that these Virtual Institutes are deeply linked to three different EC2U Joint Master Degree Programmes that adopt an innovative and interdisciplinary approach on the future of higher education.

This conference was therefore the opportunity for each Virtual Institute Coordinator to present the progress and objectives of the EC2U Virtual Institutes (in order of presentation):

- **Virtual Institute for Health and Wellbeing 'GLADE' related to the UNSDG n°3 'Health and Wellbeing'** – presented by Prof. Daniela Soitu, Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iasi
 - A focus was on the various projects of this Virtual Institute, namely the Literacy LAB, Transformative Research HUB and Management Service for a Healthy Campus.

- **Virtual Institute for the Quality of Education related to the UNSDG n°4 'Quality Education'** – presented by Prof. Dr. Raúl Sánchez Prieto, University of Salamanca
 - A focus was on the related Joint Master Degree; the mobility programmes created within the Virtual Institute to promote the collaboration of research clusters and researchers from EC2U universities which will allow up to 300 researchers to participate in these mobilities; Joint PhD Training Activities.
- **Virtual Institute for Sustainable Cities and Communities 'VISCC' related to the UNSDG n° 11 Sustainable Cities and Communities** – presented by Prof. Manuel Gameiro, University of Coimbra
 - A focus was given to the different steps of progress of the Virtual Institute for Sustainable cities and communities.

Prof. Dr. Ludovic Thilly followed the presentations on Virtual Institutes by an overview on the new research project in which EC2U universities are already involved: the "Research & Innovation for Cities & Citizens Project - RI4C2", which has received funding under the Horizon 2020 Programme "Sciences with & for Society". The RI4C2 project started in September 2021 and will run for 3 years.

She was associated Professor in UTC between 1990 and 1996 and she succeeded in her accreditation to supervise research in Mathematics at the University of Lille 1. Then she moved to the University of Poitiers, in 1996, to create a new research pole for colour image processing and analysis. Afterwards she was co-founder member of the French National Colour Imaging Group in 2000 and General Chair of the 1st European Conference about Colour in Graphics Image and Processing in 2002. In 2008 she took the direction of Signal Image and Communications laboratory, joint unit research of CNRS and University of Poitiers, part of XLim Institute, selected as one the 15 French Laboratories of Excellence (LABEX) in the area of information and communication sciences and technologies, in 2011. She was deputy director of XLim in charge of the topic Security of the Labex between 2013 and 2016. She is currently director of a CNRS research federation, MIREs, in the area of mathematics, image processing, computer graphics, computer science and communication systems. She is also Vice-Rector of Poitiers University, in charge of International Relations. At a national level, she is currently elected member of the National Council of the French Universities where she was also elected between 2008 and 2012 and appointed member between 2016 and 2019. Between sept 2012 and dec 2015, she was member of the executive board of the CNRS institute INS2I. She is also an expert for the National Agency of Research, the National Agency of Research and Teaching Evaluation (HCERES), the General Direction of Armies, and the European Commission. Carlos Manuel García Carbayo (Salamanca, 1 November 1962) is a Spanish politician, lawyer and professor. Since 2018 he has been mayor of Salamanca, for the Partido Popular.

In 1984 he graduated in Law from the University of Salamanca. After completing his university studies and passing a competitive examination, he became a civil servant in the administration of the Junta de Castilla y León.

In 1996 he began to work as a teacher of training and employment guidance in secondary schools, La Vaguada in Zamora and Ángel del Alcázar in Segovia.

He entered politics in 2001 as a member of the Partido Popular (PP). He began as head of the Studies and Documentation Service of the Regional Ministries of the Presidency and Territorial Administration and of the Interior and Justice of the Junta de Castilla y León. He was then a member of the Castile and Leon Prices Commission and deputy councillor of the Economic and Social Council. He then made the leap to Salamanca’s municipal politics as councillor for Development and Heritage. In 2015 he was appointed first deputy mayor. On 20 December 2018, he was sworn in as the new mayor of Salamanca, replacing Alfonso Fernández Mañueco, who left the mayor’s office to run for the regional presidency.



Dana Strauss

Head of office of the regional network, University of Jena

Dana Strauss works as the head of office of the regional network JenaVersum at the University of Jena. She is responsible for coordinating the collaborative platform in order to strengthen the dialogue between research institutions, the city, and businesses. Dana received her doctoral degree in social geography.

2. Description of the session

An important take away from this session was the open brainstorming activity between major stakeholders of the EC2U Alliance, notably Students, Academic Communities, Socio-economic Partners and Policy Makers. Two questions were asked during the session:

- What input(s) can you provide the EC2U ecosystem?
- What actions do you dream of when thinking about an innovative and inclusive EC2U ecosystem in 2030? (the sky is the limit!)

Both questions, though thematically different, aimed at facilitating dialogue between the various stakeholders and discussing the future of the Alliance. The idea was to empower people that are directly impacted by the actions led by EC2U.

Attendees enthused at the opportunity to voice their experience and opinions; and provided key feedback for EC2U to build upon. All responses were collected and will serve the future development of the EC2U ecosystem.

Analyzing the responses given to the questions above, shared visions came across. Succinctly, regarding the question *What input(s) can you provide to the EC2U ecosystem?* many replies focused on Engagement and Commitment; Communication and Collaboration; Experience and Expertise.

The second question *What actions do you dream of when thinking about an innovative and inclusive EC2U ecosystem in 2030? (the sky is the limit!)* gathered a wide range of replies, from “the first EC2U couples and kids” to “All other universities in European Alliances join EC2U”. However, certain common ideas can be highlighted, by stakeholder:
