Abstract

The fourth EC2U Forum took place from the 4th to the 7th of April 2022 and was hosted by the University of Pavia - UNIPV (Italy). This hybrid event was organized face-to-face, in Pavia, and online with several open activities broadcasted on [EC2U YouTube channel](#).

The Forum was open to EC2U direct members, Associated Partners, students, as well as general public, and included a wide-range of activities, such as:

- an **official reception** by the Mayor of Pavia, Fabrizio Fracassi at Visconti Castle of Pavia;
- an **opening conference** presided by H.E. Rector Magnifico of the University of Pavia, Francesco Svelto, with the presence of Maurizio Tira (Rector of the University of Brescia and Member of the Council of the Conference of Italian University Rectors with delegation to internationalization) and Ruslan Stefanchuk the President of the Ukrainian Parliament;
- an **inaugural conference** presided by H.E. Rector Magnifico of the University of Pavia, Francesco Svelto and Ludovic Thilly, General Coordinator of the EC2U Alliance, with the presence of Themis Christophidou, Director-General for Education, Youth, Sport, Culture (European Commission), Volodymyr Melnyk, Rector of the Ivan Franko University of Lviv (Ukraine) and Maxim Kozytskyi, Head of Lviv Civil-Military Regional Administration (Ukraine);
- three **public conferences** related to the EC2U Virtual Institutes which included the promotion of the three EC2U Joint Master Degrees;
- open activities led by Ludovic Thilly, General Coordinator of the EC2U Alliance, such as a **citizen science session** on “Research & Innovation for cities & citizens”, a **higher education round table** on “EWP/ESC - Digitalizing the European Universities Alliances: challenges and solutions” and a **roundtable** “Micro credential relevance for the EC2U Alliance and beyond” led by Antonella Forlino (University of Pavia) and Irinja Paakkanen (University of Turku);

- **student events:** sports events, mobility fair, workshops, training activities, social and intercultural evenings and an academic session on “The voice of students”;
- a **closing conference** moderated by Antonella Forlino, Vice-Rector for Internationalization (University of Pavia).

This EC2U Forum was the second EC2U Community face-to-face event to share the results and benefits of the Alliance and was the opportunity to better include EC2U Associated Partners, students and local communities. The EC2U Forum in Pavia has been the perfect chance to strengthen the relations within the EC2U community, also in a positive hope to really leave the COVID pandemic behind. The event also gave the chance to solidify the relations with the EC2U stakeholders, strongly involved in the event.

The Forum gathered over 400 participants of which 327 were in situ. Participants joined online, from 20 different countries, enabling the wide dissemination of the event’s content and outcomes with major stakeholders.

I. Programme and organisation of the EC2U Forum

A. Launching and organising the EC2U

1. Defining the Forum programme with the EC2U ExeCo

Ludovic Thilly, EC2U Coordinator, and Antonella Forlino, Vice-Rector for International Relations at the University of Pavia, announced the dates and location for the fourth EC2U Forum during the Executive Committee n° 13 (26/11/2021).

The University of Pavia defined the programme in collaboration with:

- Local professors, staff, and other stakeholders to develop an appropriate agenda and consequently organize the event;
- EC2U Coordination Team, Work Package Boards, and the University of Turku to detail needs and expectations particularly with regards to the students' agenda;
- The Executive Committee for the validation of the agenda.

The first two draft programmes, one general (namely full programme) and one specific to students (student programme), were presented by Alberto Forte, EC2U Administration representative from the University of Pavia and were validated by all members of the ExeCo during the Executive Committee n°15 (27/01/2022).

In January 2022, the University of Pavia carried out a detailed market research to better understand the advantages of externalizing certain management and technical services. After an internal discussion, it was decided to subcontract three different companies specialised in audio and video services to ensure the quality of the online events. All other organizational aspects of the Forum were run internally by the local EC2U team, and the GLOBEC office in collaboration with different units of the University of Pavia.

B. Communication and dissemination of the Forum: pre-event communication

Communication before the event was crucial to enhance EC2U's visibility and ensure participation from a wide range of stakeholders, notably students, local citizens and Associated Partners. EC2U chose to promote the event using both physical and virtual communication channels, notably by leveraging EC2U tools for external communication and dissemination (refer to T8.2 in the proposal). Additionally, the EC2U team of the University of Pavia collaborated with the EC2U Communication Coordinator and Officers as well as the Communication, UoC Marketing and Recruitment areas of the University of Pavia to complete EC2U promotional material when

needed. The collaboration with the Municipality of Pavia and the student association S.T.E.P. Erasmus Social Network (ESN) Pavia was equally crucial for the success of the event's visibility. A communication plan was created in advance, shared and discussed with the EC2U Communication Officers. The main communication channels were the EC2U and UNIPV websites, and their social media channels. All Partner universities actively participated in the overall communication by sharing promotional material on their communication channels. Articles from the local press of Pavia also spread key information about the Forum to the citizens.

1. Creation of an official webpage to promote the Forum Programme

Within the organisation of the event, a point of interest was developing an online space to communicate the Forum programme with students, staff, local communities, Associated Partners etc. Therefore, the UNIPV team, in collaboration with the EC2U Communication Coordinator, designed a specific [webpage for the EC2U Forum in Pavia](#), which detailed the programme of the event and logistical information.

This webpage was designed to externally disseminate key information about the Forum. The format and content were adapted to the Forum's target audience: the webpage was in English, updated and accessible over a given period of time and complementary to other EC2U communication channels.

This webpage was structured in several sections: (1) welcome, (2) programme, (3) conference venues, (4) registration, (5) practical information, (6) Covid-10 regulations and (7) contact. All people who wished to attend the Forum (virtually or physically) were required to register through the online form accessible on the webpage.

The webpage also introduced the Forum with a welcome quote from the Rector of Pavia, Francesco Svelto and the local Associated Partners as follows:

- Municipality of Pavia represented by the Mayor, Fabrizio Fracassi;
- Polo Tecnologico represented by the President, Tommaso Mazzocchi;
- S.T.E.P. ESN Pavia represented by the President, Matteo Carbone;
- CIMEA represented by the Director, Luca Lantero.

The EC2U UNIPV team also prepared different graphic materials for subsequent dissemination; supervised and validated by the EC2U Coordination team.

2. Communication on EC2U Members and Partners media

At the end of January, the EC2U UNIPV team members in charge of the Forum's communication, held an internal meeting with the Communication and Marketing departments at the University of Pavia in order to present the event and discuss how to best promote it.

The official communication for the general audience was launched at the beginning of February, when the webpage and programme were finalised and registration was open. An article was published on the EC2U website and shared on member university websites. [Read the first article published on the EC2U website.](#)

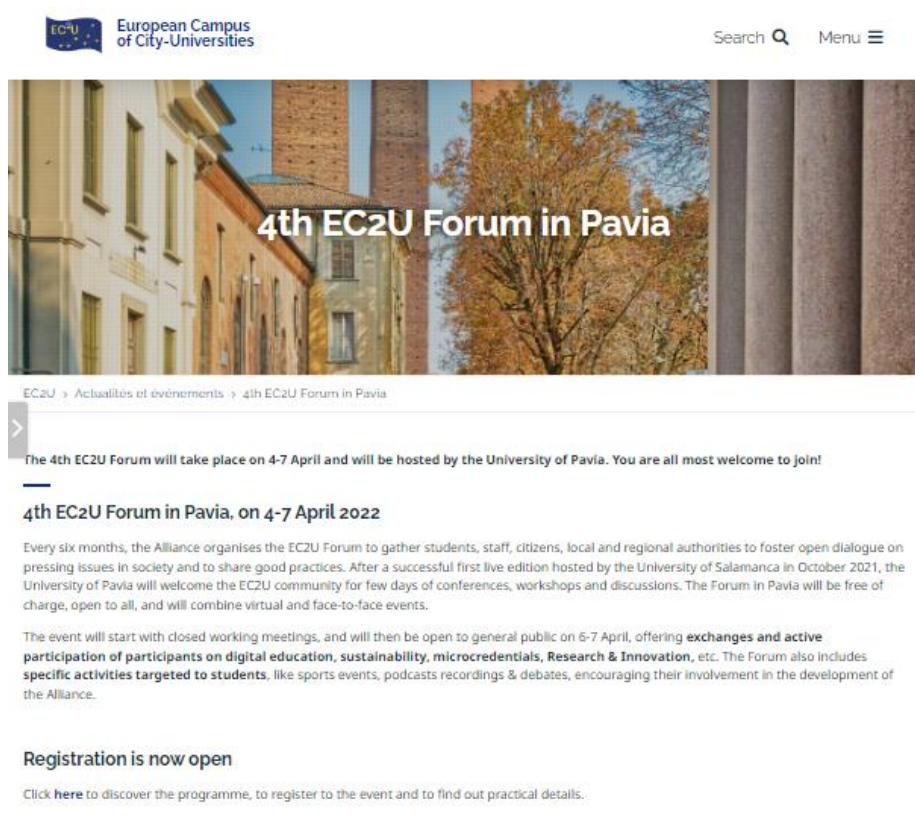


Figure 3: Screenshot of the first article published for the 4th EC2U Forum

Associated Partners and colleagues contributed to the promotion of the Forum by sharing news and disseminating news/social media posts through their networks.

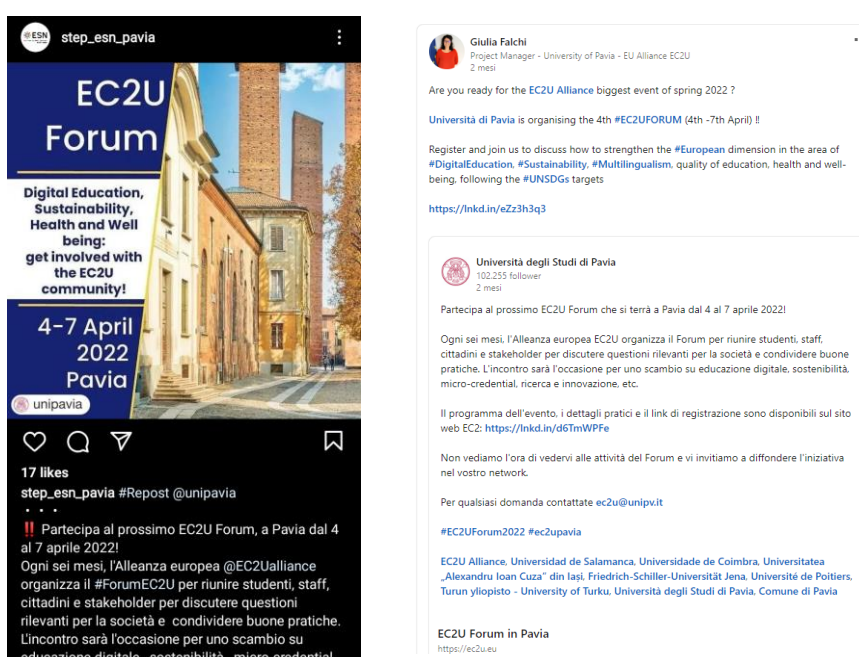


Figure 4: Social media posts by Associated Partners and members of the EC2U Community

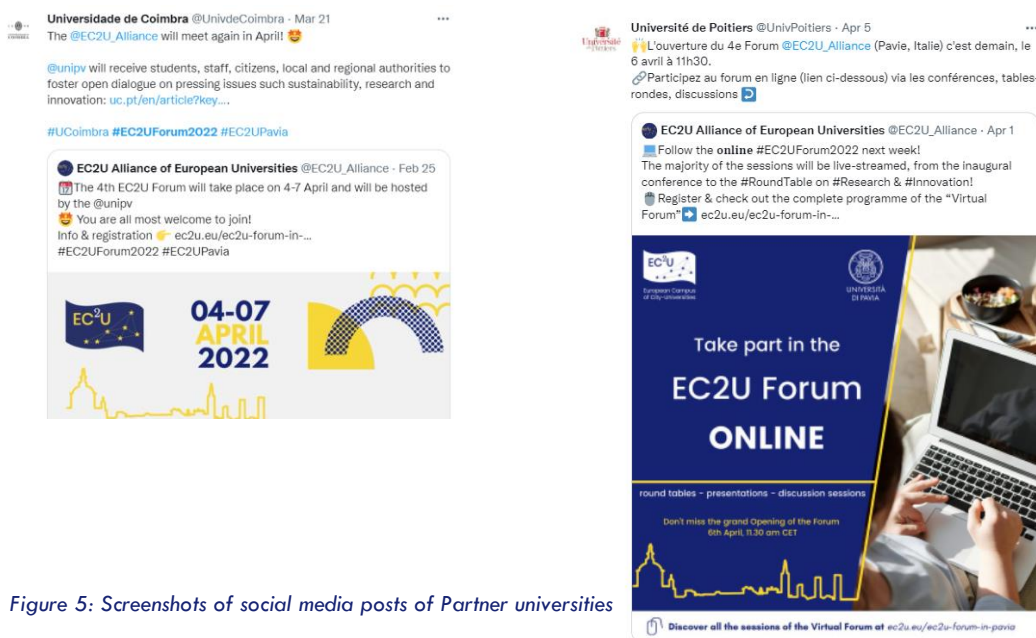


Figure 5: Screenshots of social media posts of Partner universities

C. Full programme of the fourth EC2U Forum

1. Programme of the EC2U Forum in Pavia – 4th to the 7th of Pavia

The programme of the 4th EC2U Forum was constructed taking into account the feedback received from the participants for the 3rd EC2U Forum. More activities where students, Professors, Associated Partners, civil society, and citizens could gather were, therefore, included in the programme.

In particular, a welcome and a goodbye cocktail, open to all participants, were organised on 6th and 7th of April. Local associations, focused on international cooperation and sustainability, also set up booths to share their activities with the public present.

The UNIPV EC2U team, in collaboration with Professor Stefano Ramat (Work Package 2 representative of UNIPV) and S.T.E.P. ESN Pavia, created an ad hoc programme for students which was tailored to their needs and expectations. Several internal meetings were held with the EC2U Student Representatives in order to receive their comments based also on their experience.

The result was the creation and implementation of two different programmes advertised on the EC2U website. Parallel activities to provide participants the possibility of attending the session that better matched their interests. Although two programmes were created (general/full and student), it is important to note that some activities were conceived for both since they were deemed relevant for both target audiences.

The two programmes, as illustrated below, include multidisciplinary activities from 9am to 6pm combining open conferences, round table discussion sessions, EC2U Work Package (WP) activities such as the "My Mobile Tutor App Launch", EC2U Think Tank session on "Circular Economy - Key to change and sustainability", and the [1° EC2U Entrepreneurial week](#). The latter

was led by the University of Pavia in partnership with EC2U Partners and experts on sustainable and circular economy with a dedicated programme. It is important to mention that the round table “Research & Innovation for cities & citizens” was organised in partnership with the RI4C2 project.

The 4th EC2U Forum confirms a wide visibility and high number of attendees, notably due to the “Cultcities” spillover event that took place during the EC2U Forum; an event that was directed at EC2U Associated Partners, and in particular the Municipalities of Coimbra, Iasi, Poitiers, Salamanca, Turku, and the University of Pavia. Briefly, the ‘Cultcities’ event was a 4-day gathering led by the Municipality of Pavia within the framework of the “[Cultural Cities Twinning](#)” project, a Town Twinning project, co-funded by the European Union under the Citizens, Equality, Rights, and Values (CERV) Programme.



All events were organised in hybrid mode. The majority were livestreamed on the official [EC2U YouTube channel](#). Note that certain sessions could also be joined via a Zoom link, notably when livestreaming was not an option. Below the general programme as advertised in the EC2U website:

Prof. Antonella Forlino, University of Pavia
Vice-Rector for the Internationalisation

Prof Antonella Forlino is a full Professor of Biochemistry of the University of Pavia. She has a degree in Biology, a PhD in Biochemistry and a specialization in Genetics. She teaches in the Degree Course in Medicine and Surgery (in the Harvey and Golgi Courses) and in the Degree Course in Medical and Pharmaceutical Biotechnology. She was a member of the Academic Senate in the three-year period 2015-2018. She is the coordinator of research projects funded by national and international agencies. For years she has been studying the biochemical and molecular basis of hereditary bone diseases with a translational approach. She is a member of the Scientific Committee of the Italian Association of Osteogenesis Imperfecta, of the European Federation of Osteogenesis Imperfecta and of the Care for Brittle Bone Association.



Prof. Ilaria Poggiolini, University of Pavia
EC2U WP3 Leader and member of the EC2U WP3 for UNIPV

Ilaria Poggiolini is Professor of International History and former Pro-Chancellor for International Relations (2013-2019) at the University of Pavia. She is a member of the Committee for the publication of Italian Diplomatic Documents (MAECI, Rome), of the SSH (Social Science and Humanities) Group of The Coimbra Association and UNIPV- WP and Leader for the EC2U Alliance. She is Associate of Italian Studies at Oxford.

Previously, Ilaria Poggiolini has been visiting Fulbright Scholar (USA), NATO Fellow, visiting Fellow at the Center of International Studies and Woodrow Wilson School, Princeton (USA), at the London School of Economics (LSE London) and European Study Centre, St Antony's College, Oxford. Her early research activities and publications centered on post WWII international peace making with a focus on the cases of Italy, Japan and Vietnam and on political and diplomatic relations between Italy and the Allies in the 1940s and '50s. More recently and presently, her research and publications focus on British membership of the EEC since accession, on Western European Ostpolitik in the 1970s and 1980s, on Thatcher's European and East/West policy in the 1980s and on Public Diplomacy.



Prof. Maurizio Tira, Rector of the University of Brescia
Member of the member of the Board of the Italian Rectors' Conference, delegate for international affairs

Maurizio Tira, Environmental Engineer, is Full Professor of Town and Regional Planning at the University of Brescia, member of the Academy of Sciences of Bologna Institute and the Academy of Sciences, Letters and Arts of Brescia. He is President of the National Society of Urban Planners. He acted as Member of the working group of the Ministry of Infrastructure and Transport for the revision of the technical rules for cycling safety design and of the working group of the Supreme Council for Public Works to write the Decree for the functional classification of existing roads. He was a member of the Technical Structure of the Italian Ministry of Transport and Infrastructures from 2017 to 2018. He coordinated several research units in EU funded projects about mobility and urban planning, road safety, land use planning in hazardous areas. Author of about 270 publications, he has been an invited lecturer to a broad number of conferences in Italy and abroad. Commander of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic, from December 2020. He is Rector of the University of Brescia (Italy) as of November 1st, 2016 and member of the Board of the Italian Rectors' Conference, delegate for international affairs.



Prof. Dr. Raúl Sánchez Prieto, University of Salamanca

Full Professor of German and Dutch Linguistics since 2008 and currently Director of the Department of Modern Philology. Research activity focused on the contrastive linguistics of Spanish and German (and Dutch).

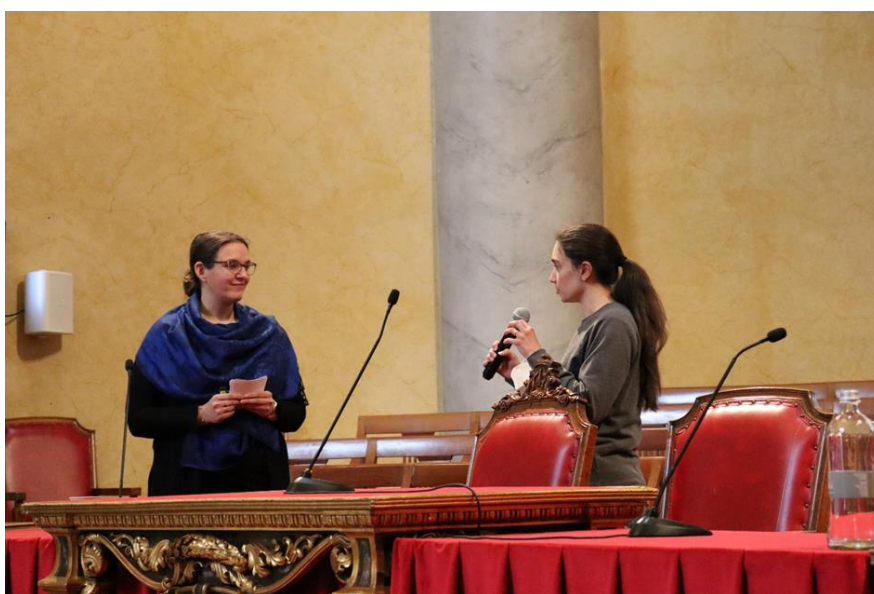


Figure 17: Irene Pampallis shares her views of the application during the MMT-EC2U launch

2nd section: A talk show on the key topics of the RI4C2 project

After a brief introduction of the structure of each RI4C2 Work Package structure as well as the goals defined by each WP Leader, a talk show on the topics of the RI4C2 project was moderated by Daniela Ovadia, EC2U-WP3 staff at University of Pavia and the WP leader of WP4 in the RI4C2 project.

Key topics included, but were not limited to:

- what is a knowledge ecosystem?
- how we can engage the stakeholders in the production of knowledge?
- how we can evaluate the research needs of our community?

- how we can use the digital environment and new technologies to work together and to develop tools for the co-creation of policy documents?

The general public (mostly students and members of the academic world) interacted with the speakers and participants, asking questions as well as expressing opinions and suggestions on the future development of the project.

9. Student events throughout the Forum

Following the feedback received from students attending past EC2U Forums, a specific agenda was created for students, an agenda that was tailored to their interests and ambitions. The main goal was to strengthen the EC2U student community. This agenda ran in parallel to the general programme, though many sessions were common to both students and staff.

The students' agenda was designed by the EC2U team of the University of Pavia, Professor Stefano Ramat (UNIPV representative for Work Package 2 - Culture and Campus Life), in collaboration with the UNIPV Student Representative and the local branch of the Erasmus Social Network (ESN).

Three main culture and sport events were organized throughout the Forum for students to promote the EC2U experience and allow students to develop long-lasting relationships with their peers from all Partner universities. These events were the following:

1. Sport-centered events
2. Collaborative workshops aimed at promoting the discussion among students with the main "The voice of students" session, the first EC2U Ambassador training and the realization of a podcast

3. Social events to develop relationships among students, which were autonomously organized by the local ESN section.

The main objectives of the student programme were successfully achieved, with notable participation of all Partner universities student delegations. During the social evening events, the student's community at the University of Pavia was actively engaged and had the opportunity to experience the atmosphere of an international week.

a) *The EC2U Mobility Fair*

The EC2U Mobility Fair took place on the 5th of April from 4.00pm to 6.30pm with the main objective of promoting exchange mobility opportunities within the Alliance. The session registered more than 450 attendees: 90% of the students came from the University of Pavia, and 10% from other EC2U universities (attendance in presence and online). Note that the event was organised into two sections with (1) an online Conference, info-session (in Aula Magna) promoting the mobility opportunities in the Alliance as a whole and (2) an in-person mobility fair (in the Cortile delle statue) where each Partner university held a booth to promote their university to the students present.

(1) Online Conference - infosession

The event entitled “*Discover the European Campus EC2U: mobility opportunities for students*” was organized from 4.00pm to 5.15pm in hybrid mode in Aula Magna and Zoom, and was chaired and moderated by the University of Pavia. This session was focused on the following topics:

- The EC2U International offices of the EC2U universities
- The EC2U European Alliance
- The Erasmus opportunities offered by EC2U

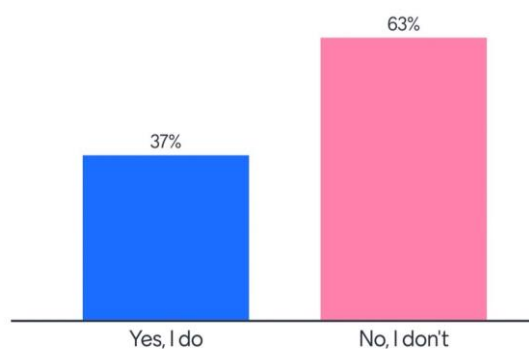

The replies show that the Alliance is known to the EC2U Community and that the Erasmus programme is associated with a positive meaning, such as 'opportunity', 'experience', 'friends', 'exchange' and 'culture'.

(2) In-person Mobility Fair

From 5.30pm to 6.30pm, the EC2U Mobility Fair took place in Cortile delle Statue, the main square of the central University and was attended by a large number of students.

Each EC2U university was provided with tables, chairs, tablecloths, and white panels. Each Partner was invited to bring promotional material to be shared with students. A happy-hour buffet was also organised during the Mobility Fair to boost discussion among students and EC2U staff.

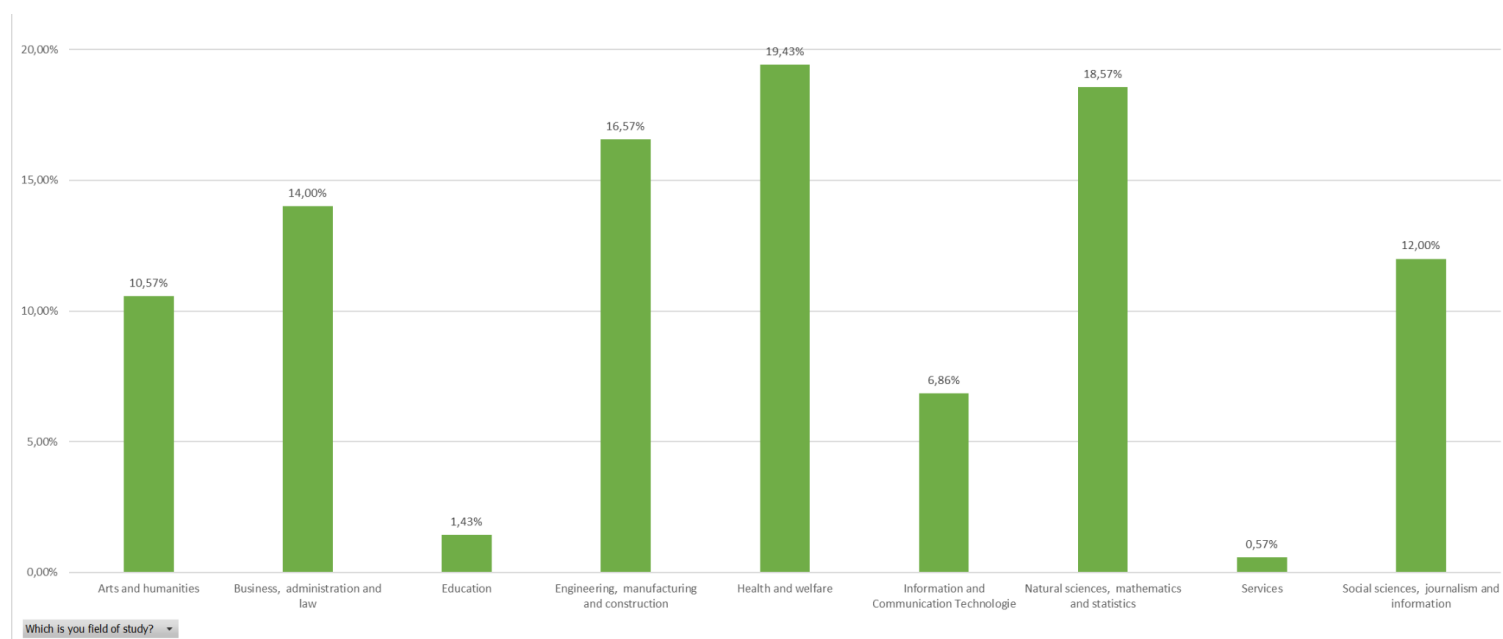


Figure 24: The EC2U Mobility Fair

From the above graphs, one can see that a majority of attendees were at the Master's Degree level. In general, STEM students demonstrate a high interest learning more about the mobility opportunities of the alliance (61%), with a majority of students from fields of study linked to the three EC2U Joint Master's Degrees (e.g. 'Health and Welfare' is related to the degree LIFELINE).

b) Intercultural activities

Students Sport Events

On Tuesday morning, April 5th, a rafting activity was organized on the Ticino river for ice-breaking among students. The group gathered at the University Sport Center (CUS) facility, boarded a tourist wheel train and was transported about 8 Km upstream to the Canarazzo site where five rafts were prepared. Three Dual Career student/athletes from the CUS kayak team and two coaches provided basic instructions to the students and led the rafts downstream to return to the starting CUS facility.

Thursday morning was kicked off with a fitness session in the Cortile Teresiano, University of Pavia. Staff from the University Sports Center led a one-hour fitness class that involved both international and Pavia students.

The fitness activity was intense but really appreciated by the student attendees. It had such a big impact and positive feedback that during the Closing conference session it was decided to extend it to the staff and general public in future similar events.

c) *The sessions 'Voice of students', podcast, and the EC2U Ambassador training*

The agenda of Wednesday, 6th of April, involved the students in three different working groups in which they had the chance to put forth their ideas to improve the EC2U Alliance with regards to student engagement. The day was devoted to brainstorming and discussion sessions:

- The first group worked on the preparation and recording of the students' podcast
- The second group worked on the discussion session "The voice of students", which was held the same day, and moderated by the students
- The third group attended the training on "How to become an effective EC2U Ambassador".

Prior the Forum, students signed up for one of the above-mentioned activities. These sessions were the opportunity for students, guided by facilitators, to work on thematic areas and increase several soft skills such as communication, teamwork, and problem-solving skills, in a multicultural environment.

Preparation and recording of the students' podcast

This activity was managed by S.T.E.P ESN Pavia and held at the GLOBEC Hub office at the University of Pavia. In the morning, the students discussed which topics to present during the podcast such as values and the importance of the EC2U Forum for students. In the afternoon, the students worked on the podcast's broadcasting.

Preparation of the discussion session 'The Voice of students'

This session was facilitated by Giulia Falchi, from the University of Pavia, and Flora Dausque, from the University of Poitiers. One week before the session, students who had signed up for this activity received by email, the [MANIFESTO FOR THE FUTURE OF EUROPE AND EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES](#) redacted by EUC (European Universities Community), focused on student engagement, in order to better prepare for the session. During two dedicated sessions (morning and afternoon), students brainstormed and discussed ideas on the future of University Alliances and selected specific topics to present during the "Discussion session: The Voice of students" (see more information below). The students considered the following themes as a priority: International environment and sustainability, Social engagement, Health care and sports.

EC2U Ambassador training: 'How to become an effective EC2U Ambassador'

This session was led by Heather Hunt, University of Poitiers, and Suvi-Anni Huhtinen, University of Turku, with the collaboration of Eleonora Lazzarin, University of Pavia. During the training session, the facilitators provided the students with information about the new EC2U Ambassador Programme. Current student ambassadors from the universities of Pavia and Turku shared their experiences, providing valuable insight and tips for the potential EC2U Ambassadors.

d) Discussion session: The Voice of students

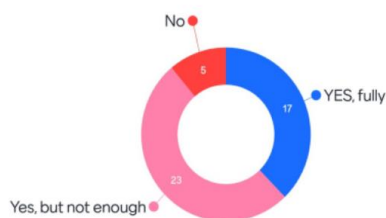
This session was the core students' activity, where they had the opportunity to express their thoughts and ideas for the future development of the EC2U Alliance.

Students prepared the sessions during the day and presented the discussion's result to the public. The debate was moderated by Giulia Falchi, from the University of Pavia, though it is important to note that all student interventions were independently elaborated by the students themselves, in order to ensure that the real voice of students were heard. The objective of the debate was to bring dialogue between students across the EC2U campus as well as between the academic community and stakeholders to discuss the following students' selected topics:

- **International environment and sustainability:** how to promote cultural exchanges, multilingualism and environmental-friendly campuses?
- **Social engagement:** how to promote community cooperation? Equality? And how to reduce the gap between Universities and the work field?
- **Health care and sport:** how their promotion and accessibility can be enhanced within the University?

Before giving the floor to students for their presentations, the audience was asked to participate in a preliminary ice breaking activity using the Mentimeter app. From the replies, the reader will clearly see that the EC2U Alliance is linked to the words 'cooperation', 'mobility', 'Europe', 'future', and 'friendship'. The aim of the session was to reach as many ideas and potential initiatives as have been discussed and will be considered for the future activities.

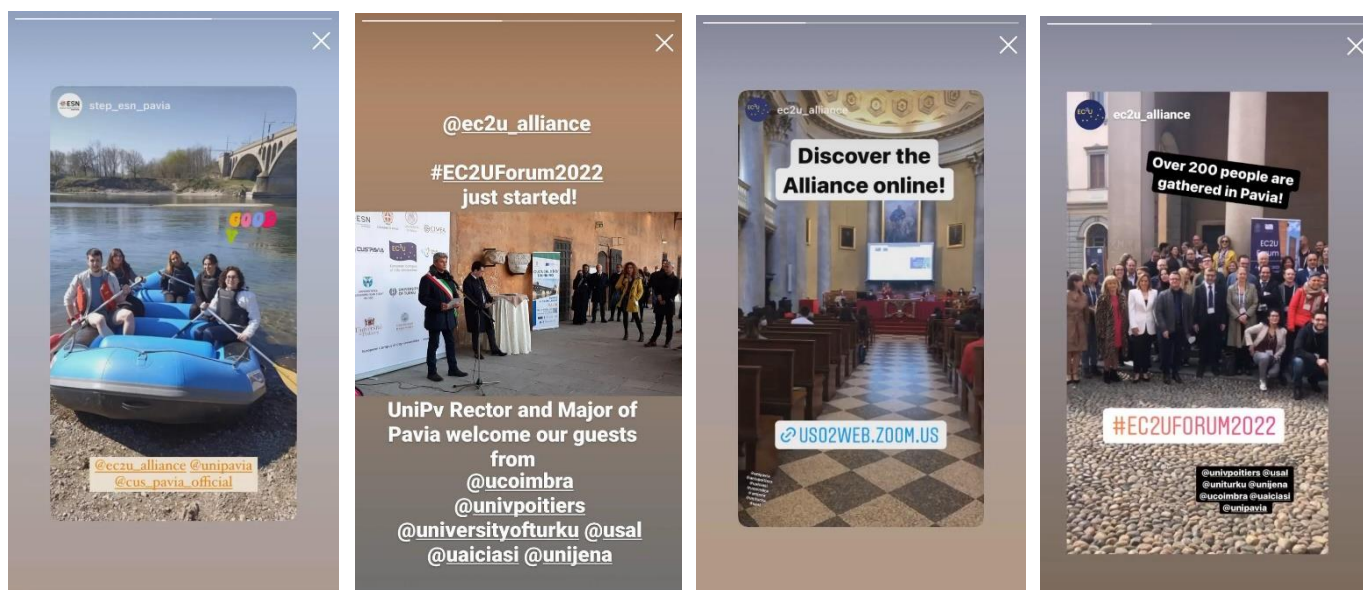


Figure 42: Examples of social media posts on Instagram

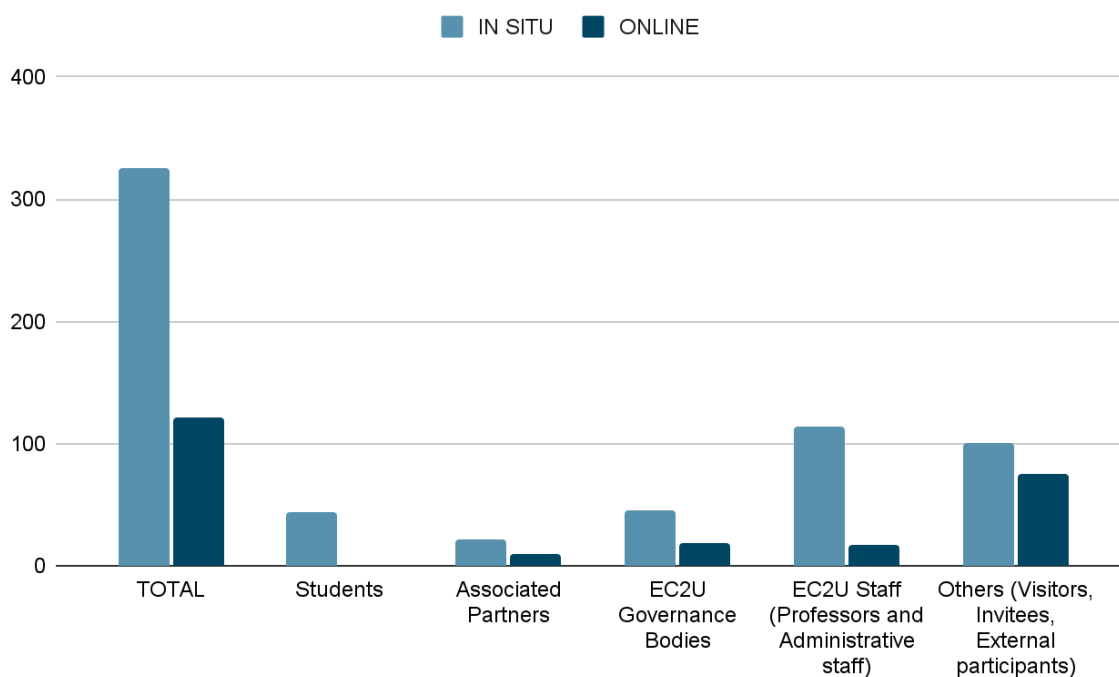

There was a total number of 327 participants in presence and 122 attendees online, which includes students, municipality representatives and Associated Partners.

More recently and presently, her research and publications focus on British membership of the EEC since accession, on Western European Ostpolitik in the 1970s and 1980s, on Thatcher's European and East/West policy in the 1980s and on Public Diplomacy.

Previously he held lead analysis and design positions for multiple international and national data interoperability projects, including the EU research project LB-4058/B-CASA "Cooperative Archive of Serials and Articles".

"The EC2U European Campus of City-Universities is an Alliance of seven long- standing universities, aiming to develop an innovative mobility space supporting free faculty, student and staff flows among partner universities and associated cities.

Central to this vision is the full digitalization of mobility-related processes through the Alliance Connect Centre, a decentralised data exchange and knowledge sharing facility tightly interconnecting local information management systems with no impact on existing processes. Mobility planning will be supported by the Alliance Knowledge Hub, a cooperative knowledge graph collecting and cross-linking data about courses, research units and skills from local systems and web sites and republishing them as a unified semantically searchable data space. Mobility management will be supported by local student management systems tightly integrated with the EWP network, extending standard protocols as required to support short and non-student mobility plans and opportunities. Mobility experience will be supported by a range of coordinated mobile-based apps, like the My Mobile Tutor local mobility guide, which are going to leverage shared data made available by Knowledge Hub facility.

A critical component of the mobile app ecosystem will be the EC2U Virtual Card, which enables faculty, students and staff to easily access local host facilities and services with no need for costly and time-consuming issuance of local or standardised alliance-wide physical cards. The virtual card was developed as a lightweight and cost-effective web-based solution on top of mature and widely adopted identity management solutions like the eduGAIN federated identity network and the European Student Card platform and will be published under an open source licence, enabling other interested parties to experiment with the concept and to cooperate to its future developments."



Castro Carlos

Project Manager of European Alliance Unite!

I was appointed PoliTO's Project Manager for Unite! in February 2020. I've also been working together with the group of mobility officers, mobility coordinators and IT experts in Erasmus Without Paper-related issues at Alliance level. I started my professional career as a globetrotting English teacher. 2. Description of the session

This round table was the opportunity to discuss the Erasmus Without Paper (EWP) and the European Student Card (ESC), which are key initiatives developed by the EU Commission to foster mobility among European Universities and facilitate sharing services and tools to the benefit of the entire student community.

To briefly contextualise, the EC2U Alliance, together with other stakeholders involved in digitalization of Higher Education, aim at implementing and broadening mobility initiatives and digitalization to the benefit of the academic community, including scholars, administrative staff, students, and potentially other stakeholders.

The main goal of this round table was to present the experience of European Universities Alliances representatives in implementing and broadening the process of digitalization following the EWP/ESC protocol, highlighting the main challenges faced, issues identified, and solutions advanced. Experts from European institutions and stakeholders directly involved with the digitalization of students' mobility, engaged with and responded to the representatives of the Alliances in an interactive and creative exchange of ideas.

The event opened with a warm, energizing welcome from the moderator, Ludovic Thilly (EC2U Coordinator), followed by a very engaging and stimulating introductory address by the EU Commission representative, Nadia Manzoni. Ilaria Poggiolini (EC2U WP3 Leader) introduced the EC2U holistic and innovative approach to the digitalization of mobility, within the framework of EWP and ESC, thus opening the session.

Alessandro Bollini, detailed the EC2U technical project related to the virtual EC2U card.

Carlos Castro told the story of how Unite! came to use eduGAIN, together with their Metacampus in order to create a Service Provider that was not originally foreseen but turned out to represent an enabling layer for application.

Maja Kolega of EU-CONEXUS provided an interesting perspective on the state of the art within her Alliance and reported on the preparatory ongoing work in the field of digitalization of mobility.

Andra Stan-Dragotesc's (UNITA) very lively presentation shed light on how their virtual campus is becoming a vehicle for community building opportunities and for digitalization of services.

Janina Van Hees of EuroTeQ interestingly underlined how their focus on the creation of the first, manual, common version of a course catalogue was achieved while preparing for an automated process that would further simplify students' registration in view of broadening mobility in the Alliance.

These presentations provided ample material for experts to pick and choose in their final round of comments. All experts, Jean Paul Roumegas (Cnous), Andrea Baldini (ENDISU), Luca Lantero (CIMEA), Velère Meus (EUF), and Nadia Manzoni, shared their experience but also provided fresh and interactive new perspectives on the future of digital mobility. They engaged with the achievements and difficulties previously presented in an interactive debate that appeared to be the basis for future collaborations not only for those present but also for some in the digital audience and within the networks of Alliances, such as FOREU1 and FOREU2.

Prof. Antonella Forlino, University of Pavia
Vice-Rector for the Internationalisation

Prof Antonella Forlino is a full Professor of Biochemistry of the University of Pavia. She has a degree in Biology, a PhD in Biochemistry and a specialization in Genetics. She teaches in the Degree Course in Medicine and Surgery (in the Harvey and Golgi Courses) and in the Degree Course in Medical and Pharmaceutical Biotechnology. She was a member of the Academic Senate in the three-year period 2015-2018. She is the coordinator of research projects funded by national and international agencies. For years she has been studying the biochemical and molecular basis of hereditary bone diseases with a translational approach. She is a member of the Scientific Committee of the Italian Association of Osteogenesis Imperfecta, of the European Federation of Osteogenesis Imperfecta and of the Care for Brittle Bone Association.

In 2019 he became the President of the Lisbon Recognition Convention Committee Bureau. From 2018 and 2020 he was the Head of the Bologna Follow-Up Group (BFUG) Secretariat of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA). He has been involved in the field of recognition for several years and he is one of the main experts at Italian and international level, on bogus diplomas and accreditation mills, foreign Higher Education systems degrees, TNE institutions and accreditation, digitalization of processes and blockchain technology applied to recognition.

"The presentation aims to provide a general overview on the current debate on micro-credentials in the field of higher education, presenting information about their characteristics, functionalities and challenges. Some examples of micro-credentials will be provided during the presentation along with the recent developments about their structures so to encourage and support their recognition among higher education institutions as well as in other sector."



Stefania Mellera, University of Pavia Responsible – Open Badge program

Stefania Mellera is Career Service Specialist at University of Pavia. She specialises in placement services for companies and students. She is leading the University of Pavia project for the delivering of open badge and she supports the development and release of micro-credentials learning units. In EC2U Alliance she is part of WP3 Micro credentials Task Force and WP7 for Career Plan Certificate deliverable. She is working at micro-credentials also as a member of the Employability Working Group of the Coimbra Group Universities.

"In the academic year 2021-2022 University of Pavia started the development of open badge ecosystem. Today we are moving from the testing to the go live phase. The achievement we show in this presentation is the pattern of open badges we are going to deliver to the University of Pavia students and also to EC2U students. UniPV open badge project does not mean only new digital certification standards but the start of "micro-credentials" design. In the second part of the presentation, we discussed the further steps that the University of Pavia would like to approach from the next academic year, especially thanks to the My Open Badge platform feature."



Agnese Salutari Representative of Reiss Romoli s.r.l., Italy

Agnese Salutari is a Senior Engineer, graduated in Computer and Automatic Engineering, and a PhD student in Information and Communication Technology (ICT) with the curriculum "Emerging computing models, software architectures, and intelligent systems" at Università degli Studi dell'Aquila – DISIM department. During her studies, she worked on several research projects before being hired by Reiss Romoli s.r.l., where she currently works on many different projects, including MY OPEN BADGE.

"MY OPEN BADGE (MOB) ecosystem is a fully integrated environment which allows to create, issue, show, and verify badge validity. MY OPEN BADGE is one of the three Platforms worldwide that has gained all three Open Badge (2.0 version) certification (Issuer, Host e Displayer). Every Organization can use the tools within MOB to take care of digital badges' management, from design to issue, as well as to show important projects which envisage badges use. On top of all this, the platform allows recipients to accept, collect and import badges, even issued by other platforms, and also allows users to create personal pages to display their competences in various ways – 'e-Portfolio'. It allows to notarize Badges' metadata and certificates over both private and public blockchain. Currently, it comprises a Template Manager too for the creation of customized certificates in several formats and in different dimensions."



Irinja Paakkanen

**Head of International Relations, Partnerships and Strategic Engagement,
University of Turku, Finland**

Irinja Paakkanen has been actively involved in international affairs over 30 years. Currently, besides enhancing the implementation of their new institutional International Programme, Irinja is involved in strategic partnerships, networks and Global Engagement such as Scholars at Risk and Global South (eg. Coimbra Group, SANORD, EC2U Micro-credentials Task Group) and Arctic cooperation. Irinja is currently chairing the Nordic NUAS Internationalisation Expert Group. She is well experienced also in project management and has lead several large EU projects and is currently the project director of external funded projects where international researchers and networking with industry are in focus.

2. Description of the session

The round table was a public event that allowed EC2U Partners, Associated Partners and stakeholders to discuss the strategic role of micro credentials in the future of education and the current of future job market.

The round table started with the interventions of the European Commission, EC2U, and CIMEA on the role of micro credentials. The subsequent open discussion focused on the internal EC2U guideline for the implementation of micro credential learning units. The round table was continued with the University of Pavia sharing its experience on micro credential learning units and the implementation of open badges as digital certification linked to micro credentials. The session closed with the presentation of My Open Badge, the platform chosen by Pavia to deliver open badges within the EC2U Alliance.

C. The Voice of Students session

Motivated by the chance to voice their opinions and experiences, EC2U Student Delegations seized this opportunity to build upon the core Sustainable Development Goals of the EC2U Alliance (UNSDG n°3, 4 & 11) and other topics relevant to them, addressing major challenges and presenting corresponding solutions. In order to be prepared for the discussion, students had been invited to read the MANIFESTO FOR THE FUTURE OF EUROPE AND EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES redacted by EUC (European Universities Community) focused on student engagement.

1. Speakers

Giulia Falchi, EC2U Local Coordinator of UNIPV, moderated the session which actively involved all participating EC2U students who attended the preparatory workshops. These students led

fruitful discussions during the day about the topics to present during the session, they created three subgroups and two or three representatives of each subgroup were invited on stage by the moderator.

The students, with the support of PowerPoint presentations, presented their ideas highlighting what and how the EC2U Alliance and its Partners could improve in order to make the Universities more student tailored, adapted to their needs and ready to overcome current challenges.

2. Description of the session

After each presentation, students asked some questions to the heterogeneous audience and were able to create a very active discussion. This session was a chance for EC2U staff, Associated Partners and local citizens to better gather student feedback to integrate student voices and experiences into EC2U activities.

Key topics and shared solutions

- **International environment and sustainability:** how to promote cultural exchanges, multilingualism and environmental-friendly campuses?
 - Goals for a more international campus life:
 - provide courses in English and mother tongue,
 - invest on language courses for international students
 - promote non-EU intercontinental student mobility, about mobility opportunities and financial/policy incentives,
 - implement internal projects like Mobility at Home,
 - implement the #Erasmus500 proposal.
 - Goals for a more sustainable campus life:
 - raise awareness regarding environmental issues (workshop and collaboration with NGOs),
 - encourage sustainable mobility (ex: provide more bikes) and food nudges,
 - publicize university rankings that measure sustainability, and further develop sustainably-built university facilities

- **Social engagement:** how to promote community cooperation? Equality? And how to reduce the gap between Universities and the work field?
 - foster the feeling of belonging to community
 - increase gender balance policy (example: use of correct terminology)
 - fight against stereotypes by realising social media campaign and manifesto
 - organise events that involve all the community while creating moments of discussion

- **Health care and sport:** how their promotion and accessibility can be enhanced within the University?
 - Mental health and student well-being:
 - there is a wall between students and teachers and mental health issues are common among university students. It's important to create common ground between students and professors and share, create activities about anxiety, depression and mindfulness. There should be easy access and affordable healthcare for all students in campus cities with a special focus should be given to mental health services.
 - Promotion of sports on University campus:
 - practising sport is beneficial for mental and physical health as well as to foster social inclusion. Promoting sport is essential for the inclusiveness, EC2U Alliance could organise event with a wide range of sports, female teams, student coaches and integrate student with disabilities (EC2U tournaments/sport's week)

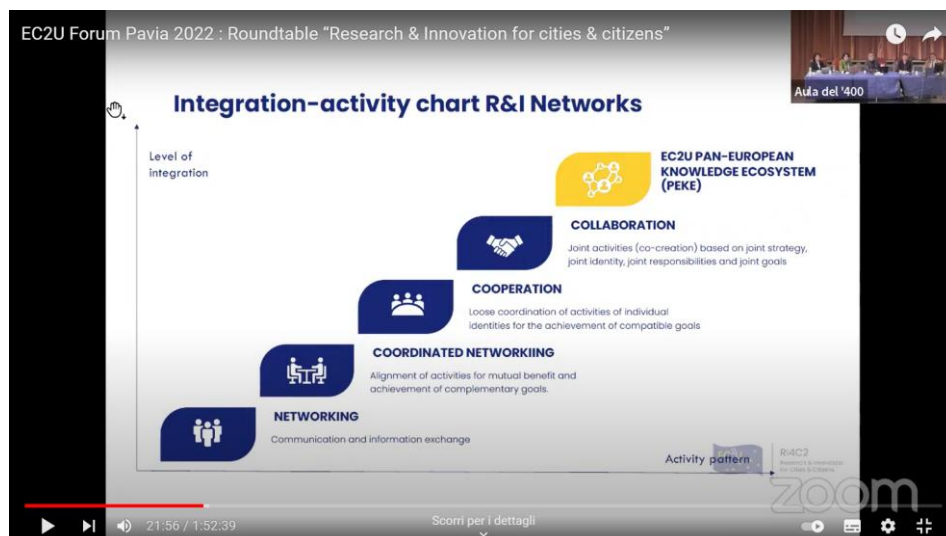


Figure 47: a screenshot of the presentation given by Ludovic Thilly

This format was a notable success in terms of audience engagement and provided both EC2U and RI4C2 with a lot of valuable information to be used for upcoming activities.

Here below some of the questions and topics discussed with the WP Leaders:

- An Alliance is also a cultural hub for the academic community and beyond, especially when we tackle issues like the SDGs. What is our role in disseminating the scientific basis of the SDGs?
- What is the role of open science in opening the academic world to the city and the citizens? How do you plan to promote the OA model within your community?
- What is a knowledge ecosystem, from where we take this concept and how it applies to the universities? How can we involve the citizens in the production of science and why it's important for the quality of our research?
- How do we promote the values of the academic world through Alliances? How can research and innovation move to the heart of a city?
- How can a common digital platform help overcome the issues related to common policy among academic institutions on sensitive issues like gender equality, researchers' behaviours, common procedures and open science?

- What is the Human Resources Strategy for Researchers (HSR4R) and what can an Alliance do to support it? What is, according to the project, the role of an alliance in promoting the career of the young scientists and which are the main barriers?
- How do we plan to identify new common areas of interest that could lead to common research institutes? What is the role of a Virtual Research Institute in harmonizing research practices and goals?
- How can a consortium overcome the problem of multilingualism?
- What is the role of an academic Alliance in shaping the future of the European high education landmark?

Studied abroad in Brno, Czech Republic (2015-16), and Split, Croatia (2016-17), under the Erasmus+ program. In 2018, enrolled the doctoral program in Sustainable Energy Systems under the Energy for Sustainability initiative - MIT Portugal at the University of Coimbra. In July 2019, finished the curricular course of the doctoral program. In September 2019, started the doctoral thesis. In February and March 2020, was visiting the Department of Conservation at Trinity College Dublin in a research internship as part of his doctoral project. Participated as a research fellow in 3 projects that explored building simulation tools to study the hygrothermal and lighting conditions; and monitored and assessed environmental conditions in heritage buildings from a preventive conservation perspective. As a result of his research, published 4 papers in international scientific journals and participated in 7 international conferences. Main research interests are building simulation, climate control systems, energy efficiency, heritage buildings, indoor air quality, and preventive conservation.



Elisabetta Doria, University of Pavia

Elisabetta Doria is a Ph.D. student in Design, Modelling and Simulation in Engineering at University of Pavia, and Contract Professor at University of Pavia in "3D database survey and management activities". Her research areas concern protocols and methods for the management and conservation of historic buildings, documentation and digital survey of historic territories and cities in Europe and Holy Land and management of databases for information systems integrated with three-dimensional models. Since 2018, as research fellow, she has participated in activities organized by DICAr – Department of Civil Engineering and Architecture of the University of Pavia. She has participated in national and international research projects for historical, monumental and UNESCO sites, aimed at enhancing the architectural and landscape heritage through the management of digital databases and for the devising and development of protocols for conservation of urban heritage.



Miguel Angel Andres Llamas, University of Salamanca

Miguel Ángel Andrés Llamas works as a postdoctoral researcher in the Administrative Law Area of the University of Salamanca, an institution where he graduated in Law and Political Science and obtained master's degrees in Democracy and Good Governance and Legal Practice. He has been a freelance lawyer, associate professor at the University of Valladolid and legal advisor to the Congress of Deputies. His doctoral thesis received the VII International Research Award from the García Oviedo Institute (University of Seville).



Prof. Marco Morandotti, University of Pavia

Associate Professor in the field of Technical Architecture, he was coordinator of the PhD in Building Engineering/Architecture, and is currently Director of the Interdepartmental Study and Research Centre for the Conservation of Cultural Heritage (CISRIC).

His main research activities concern the recovery and conservation of the historical-architectural heritage; typological and technological issues related to the design of hospital buildings; construction techniques oriented towards building sustainability also in developing countries. Since 2019 he has been a member of the Board of Directors of the EDiSU of Pavia



Prof. Lucian Sfica, University Alexandru Ioan Cuza Iași

Associate professor at Faculty of Geography and Geology from „Alexandru Ioan Cuza” University from Iași, Romania. Main research fields, Meteorology and Climatology, Climate change, Climate of Romania, Synoptic meteorology and forecast, Spa tourism, GIS in Climatology

2. Description of the session

Each public conference integrated key topics related to a given Virtual Institute. The idea of these conferences was to bring to the table different point of views from stakeholders with diverging profiles, such as policy makers, scientific experts, professors, PHD and post-doc students and interact with the audience.

The **GLADE Virtual Institute “Good Health and Well-Being for all”** related to WP4 analysed the topic from diverse perspectives considering also the different backgrounds of the speakers. After the introductory remarks, Prof Netedu showed the results of a comparative study of the #SDG3 Targets in the seven EC2U countries which caught the attention of all the audience, particularly when they all realised how much there is still to do. The conference continued with an economic focus investigating how artificial intelligence could be applied in/to the healthcare sector. The last two interventions were oriented towards a more global scale addressing the needs of local governance and the society in general. The following main elements were highlighted. Promoting healthy communities is at the heart of what local governments should aspire to. This requires action on upstream determinants of health and good urban governance in the pursuit of collective goals. Governance is considered a key factor of urban health and can be used to foster healthy public policies at the local level. In addition to the local government, stakeholders across different sectors should be involved, among others, academia, healthcare and social sectors. In this field, Universities can play a pivotal role in providing evidence-based input on health issues and as catalysts of stakeholders’ mobilization to build local healthy Alliances. Prof. Angela Freitas, Prof. Paula Santana, Phd. Ricardo Almendra and Prof. Daniela Soitu presented preliminary results of a study on stakeholder engagement at the local level developed in seven cities (Salamanca, Pavia, Poitiers, Wien, Iasi, Coimbra, Turku) involving around 100 stakeholders considering the following five target profiles: i) local government (city councillors, municipal departmental staff), ii) academia (researchers working in urban health topics), iii) healthcare sector (local health authority, healthcare providers), iv) third sector (e.g., voluntary and NGOs, private institutes) and v) community (local associations).

After the presentation there was a fruitful discussion around: 1) stakeholders’ opinions about health in their cities and the potential of city policies to promote health equity, 2) level of University-Cities cooperation in health promotion, knowledge transfer, and exchange and 3) the constraints and opportunities of intersectoral action for health.

The **VIQE - Quality Education Virtual Institute “Digital and Computational tools and methodologies for interdisciplinary research on Language, Culture and Society”** related to WP5 was structured in two sessions. Indeed, after the presentation of academic experts focused on digital literacies and how to teach and learn a foreign language, there was a student booster session, which was highly appreciated by the audience. Prof Clara Keating shared with the EC2U consortium how she and her colleagues have been about exploring, with students, the study of human language activity mediated by technologies describing the sociolinguistic stance proposed in both undergraduate and postgraduate courses focused on multilingual literacies mediated by digital media. She drew the attention to the Jones & Hafner (2012) approach to digital literacies to explore how algorithms and platform designs work as part of a distributed set of resources that configure and mediate students' social and cultural identities - both online and offline, enacted in the here and now of students' engagement with technological devices and their affordances – and how that can open up innovative ways of understanding language and literacy as being situated and traversed by personal, cultural, social, semiotic – both human and non-human trajectories.

The **SCC Virtual Institute “Sustainable Cities and Communities”** had a hybrid audience being followed both online and in presence. The welcome speech held by Benno Werlen, UNESCO Chair on Global Understanding for Sustainability (University of Jena) focused on Cultural and regional dimensions of global sustainability. Colleagues from Jena also showed the results of a study that analysed the societal response to heat waves in Germany by predicting multiple societal attention and impact metrics scales with various temperature variables at weekly time scales. They concluded that defining potentially harmful temperature conditions from a societal perspective offers the potential to better understand and manage future heat wave impacts. The following presentation of Miguel Ángel Andrés Llamas (University of Salamanca) was an analysis of the public policy of sustainable urban development in the European Union, exploring how environmental issues have been incorporated into European urban policy with a specific focus on the origin and evolution of the Urban Agenda of the European Union. Nuno Saraiva (University of Coimbra) discussed with session participants about the simulation of the indoor environment: Tools for a comprehensive assessment of conservation. One focus was on heritage buildings:

Heritage buildings represent part of our cultural patrimony and contribute to the passing of values between generations. However, this type of building is highly visited and suffers from

intense touristic pressure ending up being victims of their own success. For this reason, it is important to pay close attention to what happens around them and ensure that the good conservation of any cultural patrimony is not jeopardized. The indoor environment is one of the key factors that influence the good conservation of collections and artifacts. As a complementary tool to monitoring approaches, simulation is a useful procedure in the characterization and assessment of the indoor environment. After careful validation resulting from the comparison between measurements and predictions, simulation can be used for several purposes. It not only allows a comprehensive analysis of the several parameters that characterize the indoor environment but also contributes to the pursuit of solutions. Solutions that mitigate problems and improve the quality of collections' conservation. Finally, the positive contribution of simulation should be highlighted, especially in heritage buildings where there are no second chances. Every change in the building should be carefully studied and analyzed to avoid any patrimony loss.

The conference concluded with the final remarks of Prof. Marco Morandotti that presented the result and further development of the Winter school BSURE realised in partnership with the Municipality of Pavia and EC2U partners (here the video)

The aim of the three public conferences was to provide attendees with general information on the three EC2U Virtual Institutes and the EC2U Joint Master's Degrees. The three public conferences were held in hybrid mode at the University of Pavia and through the Zoom platform. The underlying goal was to present the Virtual Institutes' progress, outcomes and benefits for various stakeholders, hence ensuring a common understanding and basis for future dialogue with citizens. These conference underlines the importance of the Virtual Institute as knowledge transfer hub where to develop networking, sharing studies and best practices and initiate collaborations.

This Forum was the ideal occasion to launch the My Mobile Tutor App and the admission calls for the three EC2U Joint Master's Degrees. The first EC2U Mobility Fair, sharing the long and short-term mobility opportunities within the Alliance, was equally a great success. Additionally, the Forum perfectly showcases the strong relationship established between the Associated Partners and the EC2U Alliance which was strengthened during the event.

The most emotional moment was the opening ceremony with the online interventions of the President of the Ukrainian Parliament, Ruslan Stefanchuk, Maxim Kozyskyi, Head of Lviv Civil-Military Regional Administration (Ukraine) and Volodymyr Melnyk, Rector of the Ivan Franko University of Lviv (Ukraine) who signed the Memorandum of Understanding with all the EC2U Rectors making the entrance of the University of Lviv to the EC2U community as Strategic Partner official.

The session *"The voice of students"*, the higher education round table *"EWP/ESC - Digitalizing the European Universities Alliances: challenges and solutions"*, the round table *"Research & Innovation for cities & citizens"* and *"Micro credential relevance for the EC2U Alliance and beyond"* witnessed the highest audience's involvement through questions and discussions after the speakers' interventions. This confirmed that the topics selected were of great interest to the public and that, given their involvement, the Alliance must continue to invest and work in this direction by channelling the needs and ideas of the EC2U community in order to address the current challenges under the three United Nations Sustainable Development Goals #3, #4, #11 - core to each EC2U activity.
