The EC2U Alliance is a multicultural multilingual Alliance of engaged, education- and research-driven European Universities. Our mission is to build a European Campus that empowers its community via new models of education, exchange, and learning.

This annual report shares the main achievements between November 2023 and November 2024.

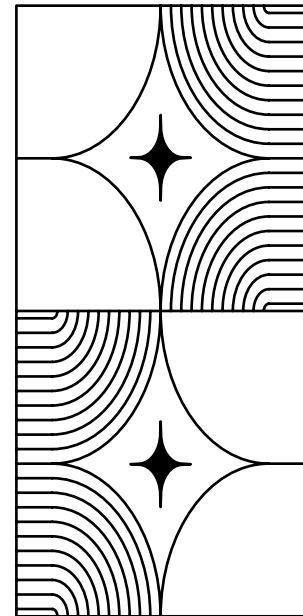


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EC2U **Ecosystem**

A growing community

Launched in 2020, the EC2U Alliance is a now thriving community of more than **200 000 students** and **35 000 staff members**.

People-centred, EC2U's success has been celebrated via renewed funding from the European Commission (November 2023), which brings EC2U into a new era: one of **consolidated activities** and **new opportunities**.

These opportunities are made possible due to the commitment of **a diverse network** of people from university staff members to an active web of Associated Partners, that includes the municipalities of each city-university. This engagement is supported via an adapted governance structure that allows multi-level cooperation.

Focus: the EC2U Student Council

The 1st **EC2U Student Council** was launched in November 2023. **Created by students, for students**, this governing body has, over its 1st year, shown the true potential of cooperation.

The student community at each EC2U university is represented by two students who contribute to the decision making processes of the Alliance via recommendations and general consultation. Since its creation, **over 90% of Student Council recommendations have been implemented** by the EC2U Alliance.

How has EC2U impacted you?

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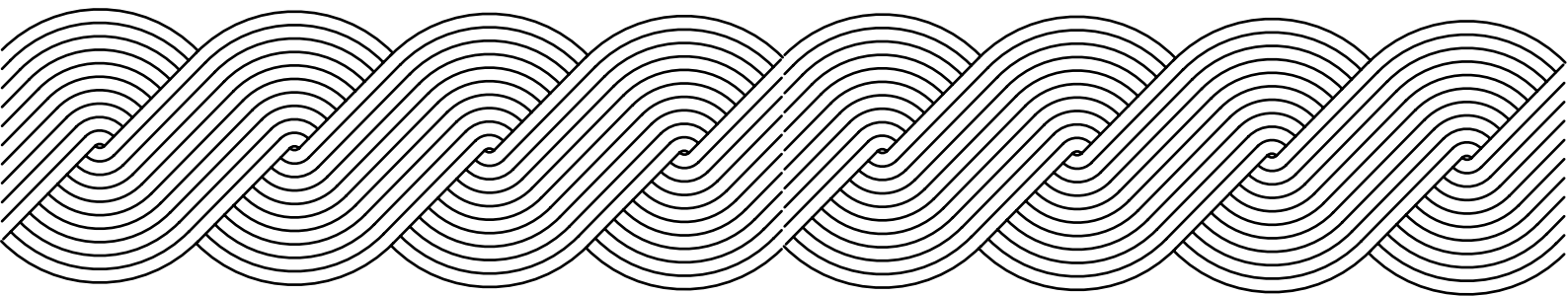

May 2024

EC2U Student Event

71 students from across Europe. 1 city: Iasi, Romania.
Framed around citizen engagement, the event brought students to collaborate on what it means to be a European citizen today.

Jul. – Oct. 2024

EC2U Think Tank

9 Think Tank sessions were organised between October 2023 and October 2024. The topic: “Social Innovation for peace-building”. Focus: mobility

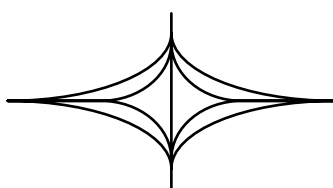
The connection between people within EC2U also happens thanks to short-term, flexible mobility opportunities. In only 12 months, EC2U events welcomed **over 500 mobile students and staff members.**

Generally one week-long and financed by the EC2U Alliance, the event-related mobility opportunities are a great way to network within a European Community. EC2U events participants were asked what motivated them most to join EC2U activities and the mobility opportunities coupled with getting to know each other were the most cited.

Research **successes**

Via multi-disciplinary research hubs called EC2U Virtual Institutes, the EC2U Alliance contributes to research related to United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

These Virtual Institutes connect researchers and external stakeholders, with the objective of creating a tight-knit community that works towards innovative joint projects. For example, the EC2U Alliance is leading a global study on health and safety within all EC2U cities and universities to identify new challenges and opportunities.

A main achievement of the academic year 2023 – 2024, is the **launch of the 4th EC2U Virtual Institute** *Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions* (UNSDG #16) which complements the three EC2U Virtual Institutes (VI) that have been successfully running since 2021:

- VI on *Good Health and Well-Being*
- VI on *Quality Education*
- VI on *Sustainable Cities and Communities*

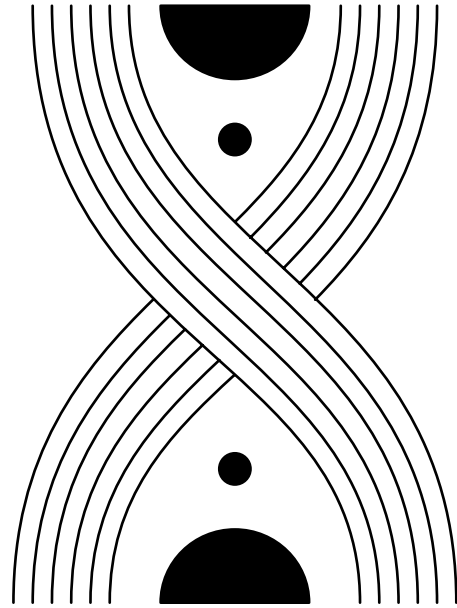

Education achievements

The EC2U Alliance offers three Joint Master's Programmes each centred around United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDG):

- Lifelong Well-being and Healthy Ageing (UNSDG#3)
- European Languages, Cultures, and Societies in contact (UNSDG#4)
- Sustainable Cities and Communities (UNSDG#11)

A key objective is to provide multi-disciplinary, customisable, and mobility-intensive training opportunities to students, while guaranteeing their employability in socially relevant fields.

Successfully launched in 2022, over 15 students of the **1st cohort of students graduated** from the EC2U Joint Master's Programmes.

How has EC2U impacted you?

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This master's really opened up a lot more doors for me with regards to my professional life. My bachelor is in a niche category, so with this masters I was able to open myself up to many more other career potentials. Personally, it really helped me understand cultural diversity, immersing myself into different cultures and the aspect of just moving from one city to another city was quite interesting.

Conclusions

EC2U, in 2024, is a community of 200 000 students, 35 000 staff members, 2 million citizens. Between November 2023 and November 2024, EC2U completed 30 milestones and submitted 2 deliverables to the European Commission. EC2U organised 30 events that welcomed over 1500 participants with an average satisfaction rate of 91%. EC2U increased short-term and long-term mobilities. EC2U allowed new research projects and continued innovation.

2024 confirmed EC2U's capacity to contribute to the European Higher Education Area. The EC2U Joint Master's Programmes and the short-term research intensive mobilities prove the EC2U Alliance is developing new models of education and exchange. This year, a 4th EC2U Virtual Institute on Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions was created and an Annual Doctoral Colloquium focused on PhD employability was launched.

The success of EC2U activities is reliant on a sustainable model of governance centred around cooperation and transparency. This allows diverse profiles to come together and create their Alliance. 2024 celebrated the

creation of the EC2U Student Council for example.

These agile governance and management models ensure the growth of EC2U has positive impacts at both global and local levels. For example, EC2U welcomed a new university in 2024, Johannes Kepler University of Linz, while continuing its strong cooperation with all Associated Partners, including the Ivan Franko university of Lviv (Ukraine).

The EC2U Alliance is entering its 5th year; a year of foreseen growth and new activities.

We hope to empower our community to a better tomorrow and for that vision alone we thank everyone involved in the EC2U Alliance.
